This information is intended to support Area Councils to identify some of their strategic priorities and commission services to meet these challenges.

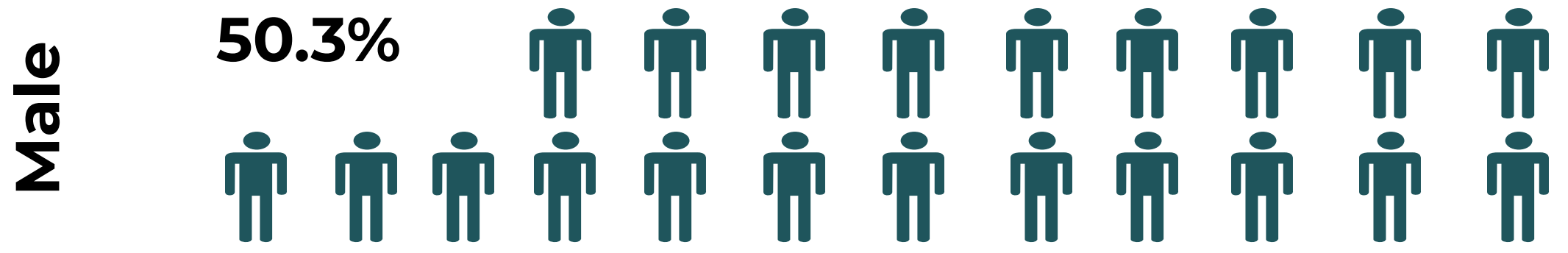
Demographics

56,698

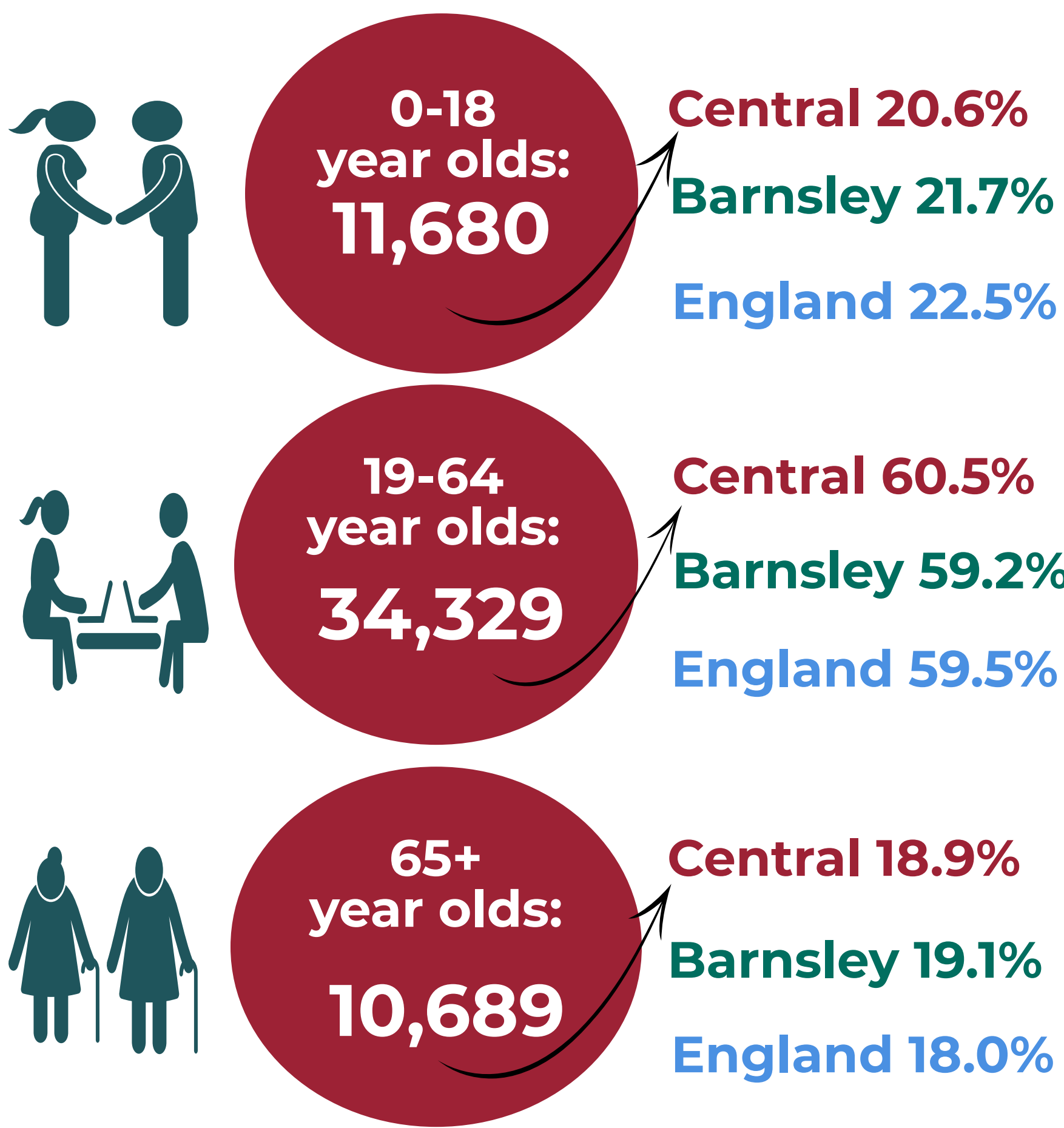
Up **7.0%** since 2011

Barnsley's population has been growing constantly since 2001. Since the 2011 Census, the resident population of Central has increased by 7.0%, whereas across Barnsley there was a 4.9% increase. These increases were mainly due to more births than deaths and international migration.

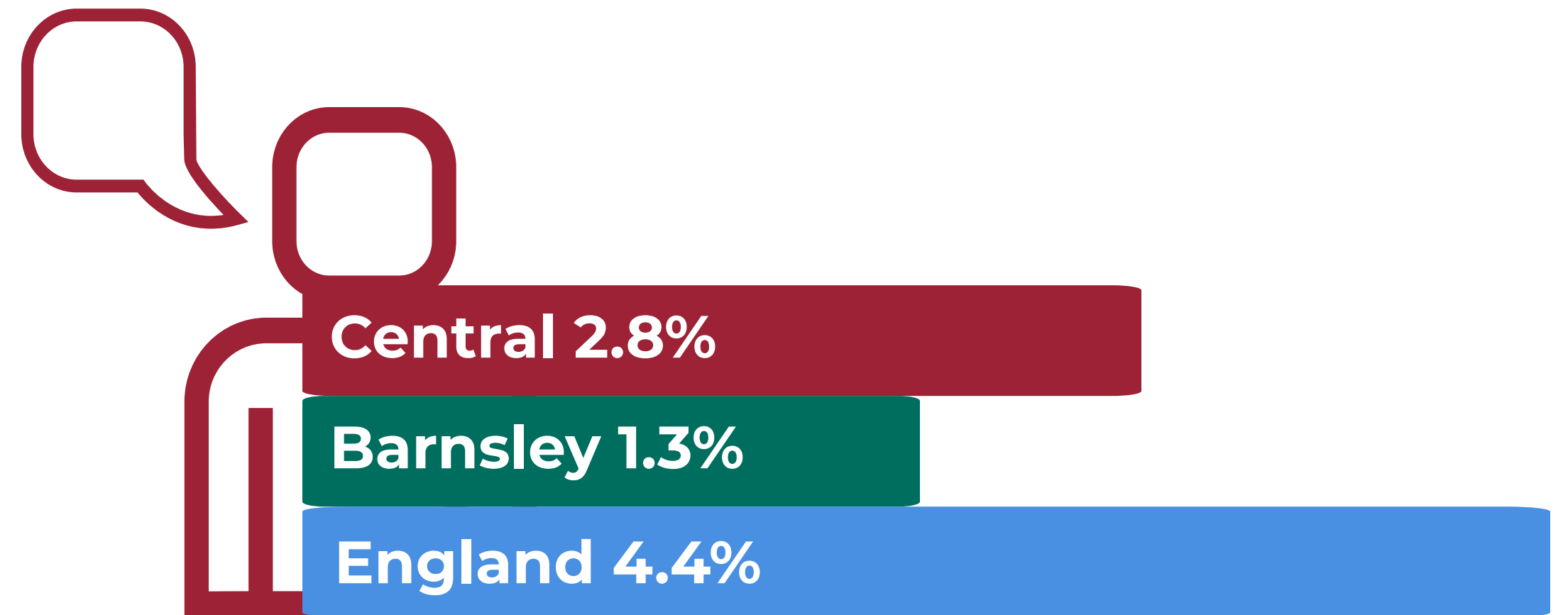
Age Profile and % of Total Population



The age profile of the population is changing both locally and nationally due to the rising number of people aged 65+ years. The resident population of Central consists of less young people (under 19 years) and a slightly higher rate of those of working age in comparison to Barnsley and nationally.

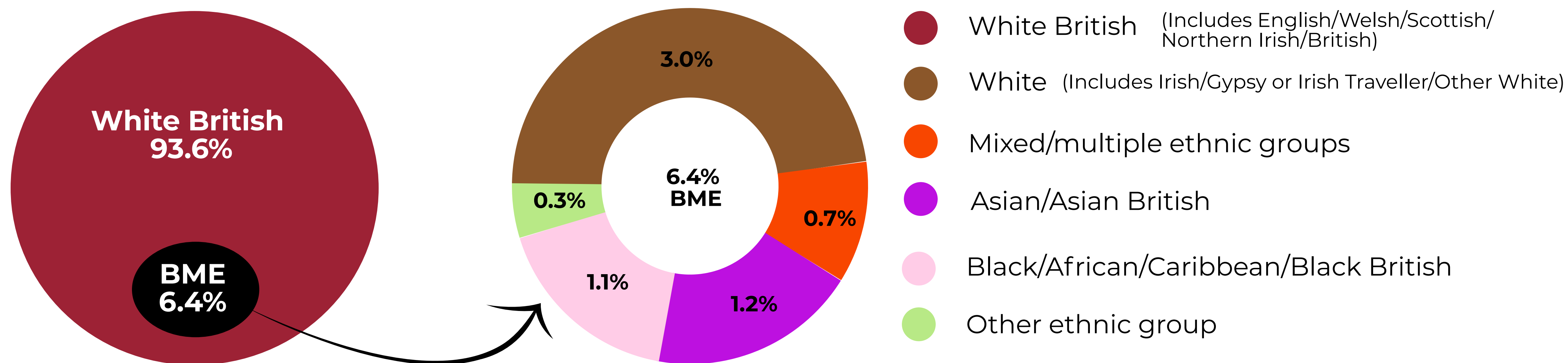

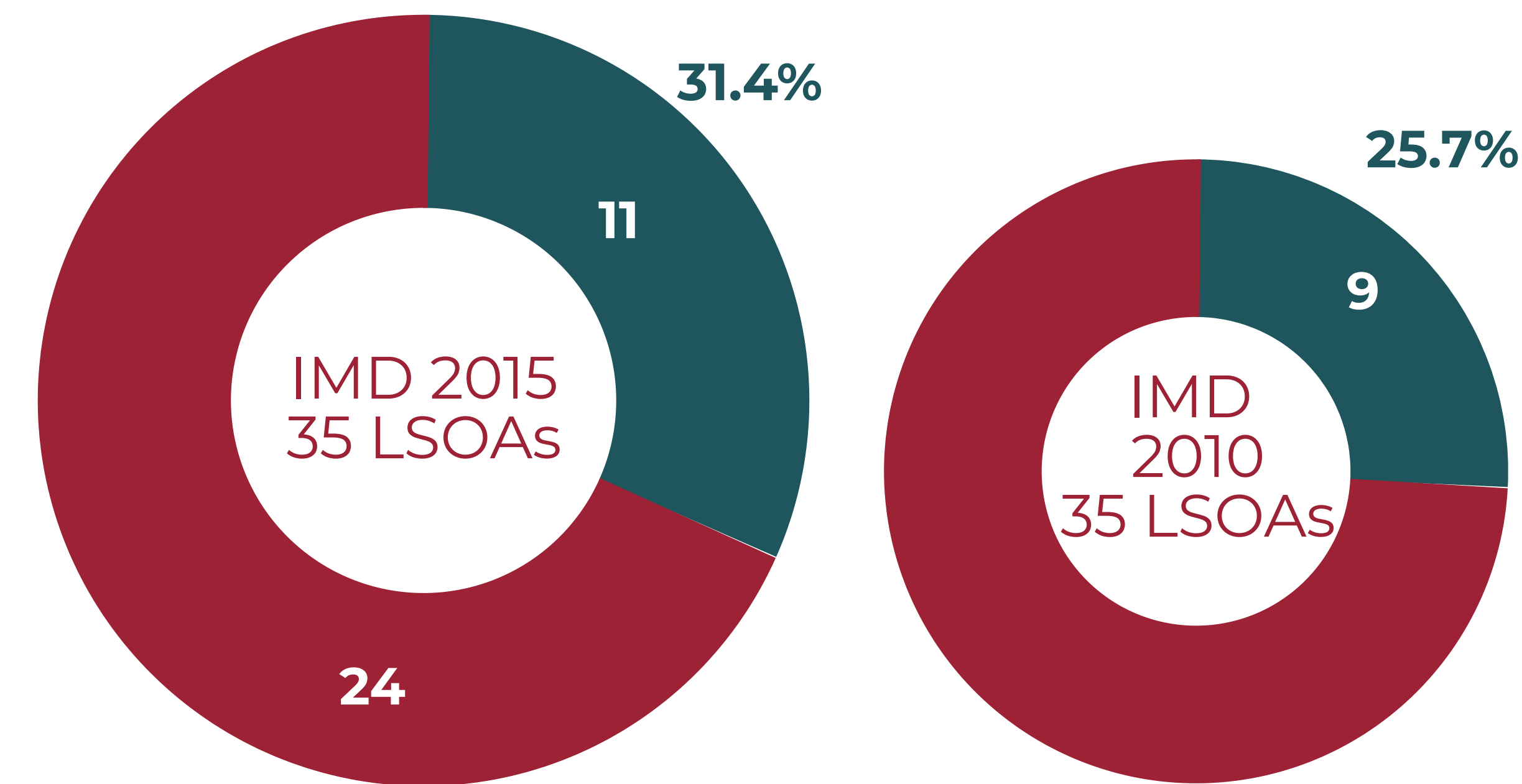

This is calculated based on seven domains of deprivation, which in turn are composed of a number of indicators that are scored and ranked to produce an overall domain score.

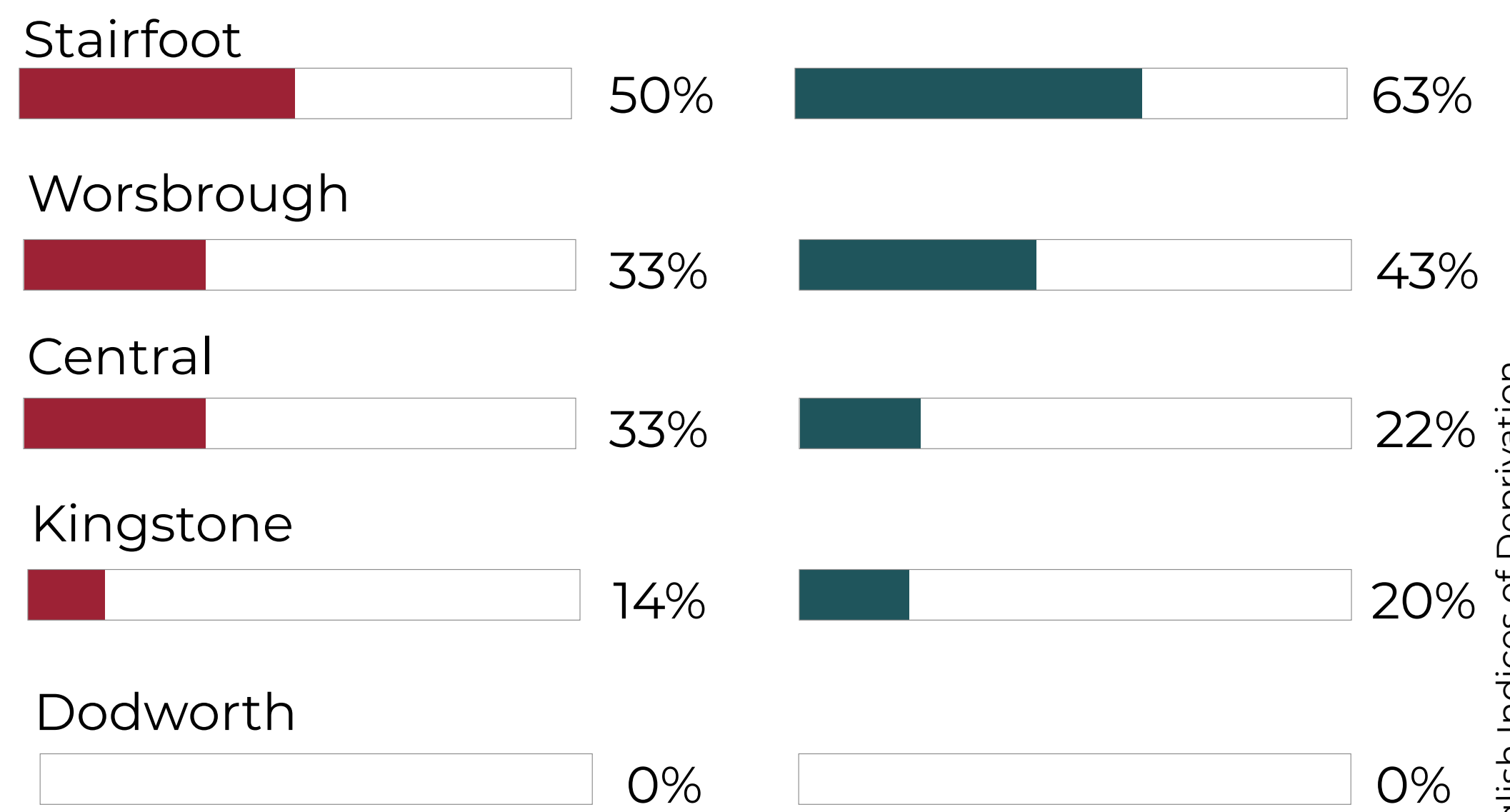
Proportion of Central Lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs) in 10% Most Deprived in England

- LSOAs not in 10% Most Deprived in England



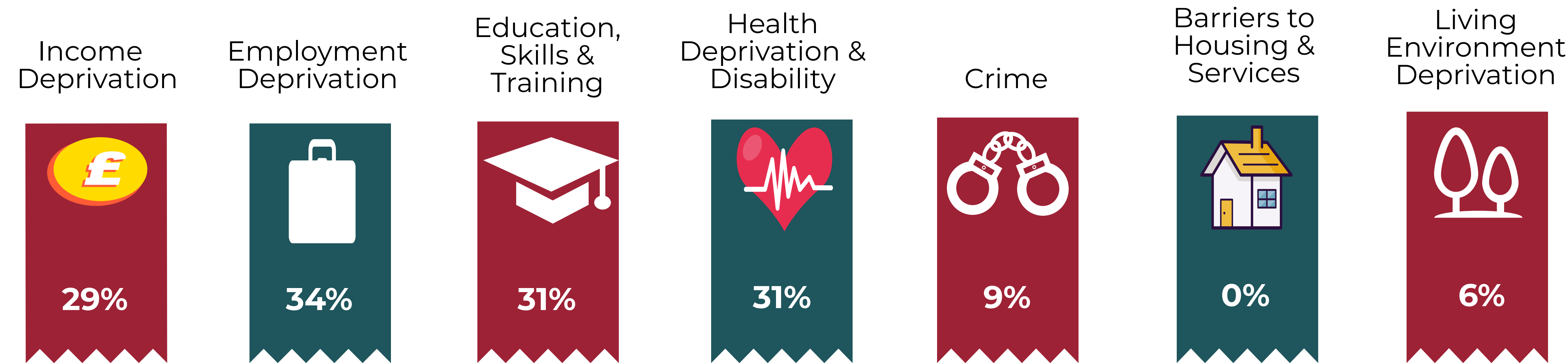
The Proportion of LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Wards in Central Area

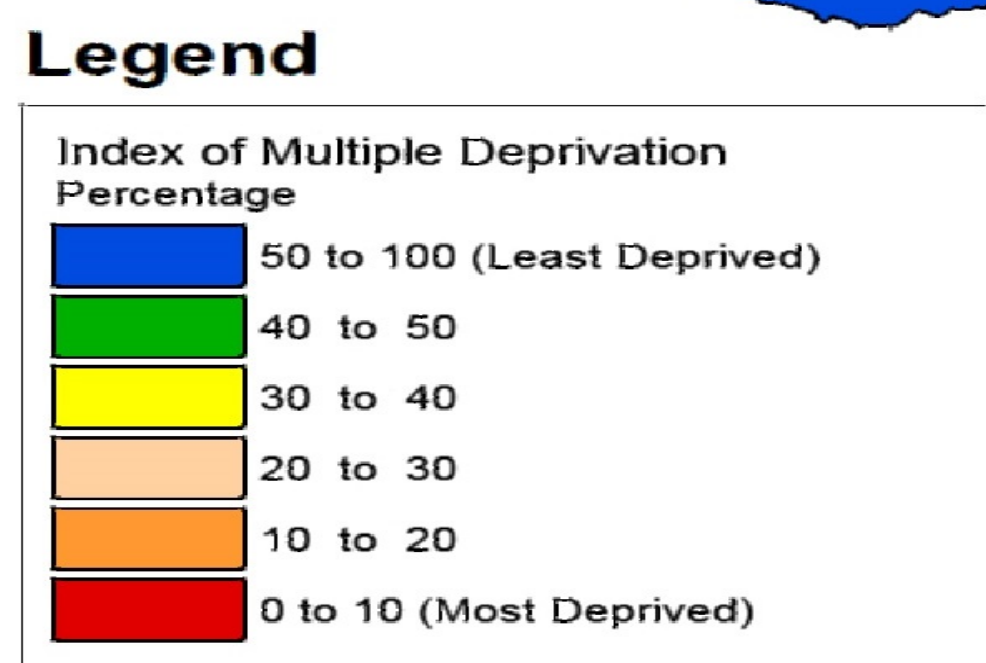
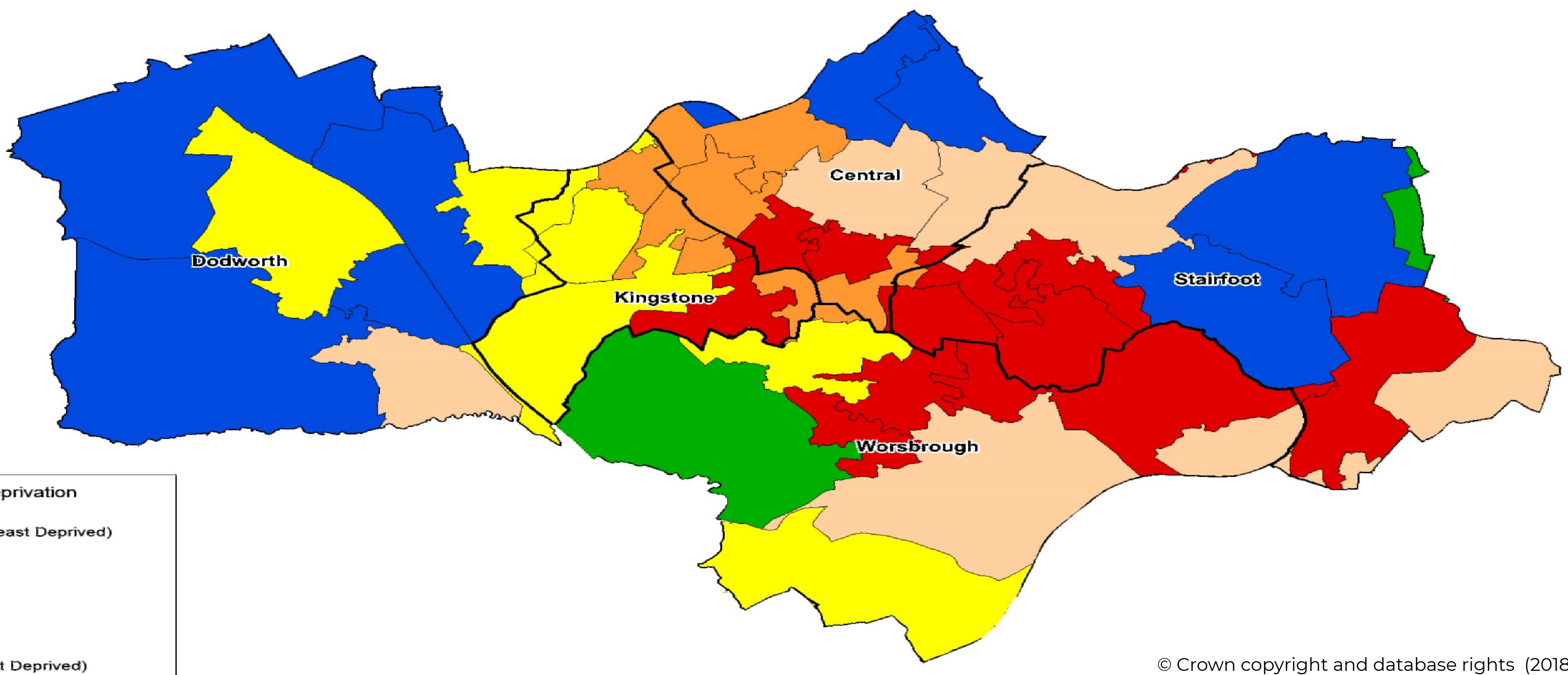


The Seven Domains of Deprivation and how Central Performs

Percentage of Central area LSOAs in the Bottom 10% in England by Domain

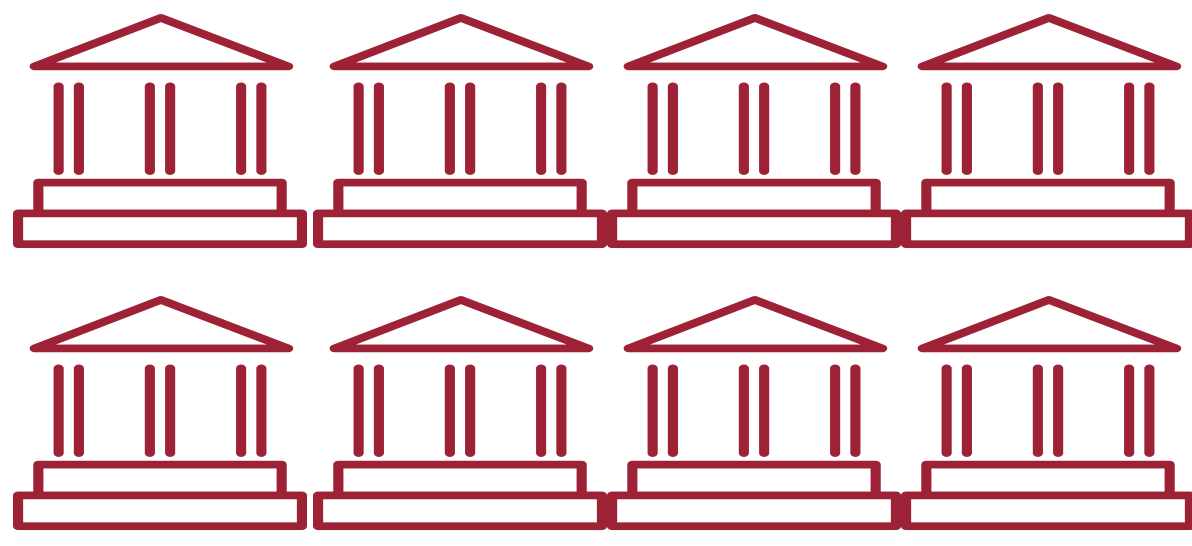


Index of Multiple Deprivation 2015 Central Area Council LSOAs Relative to England (DCLG, 2015)

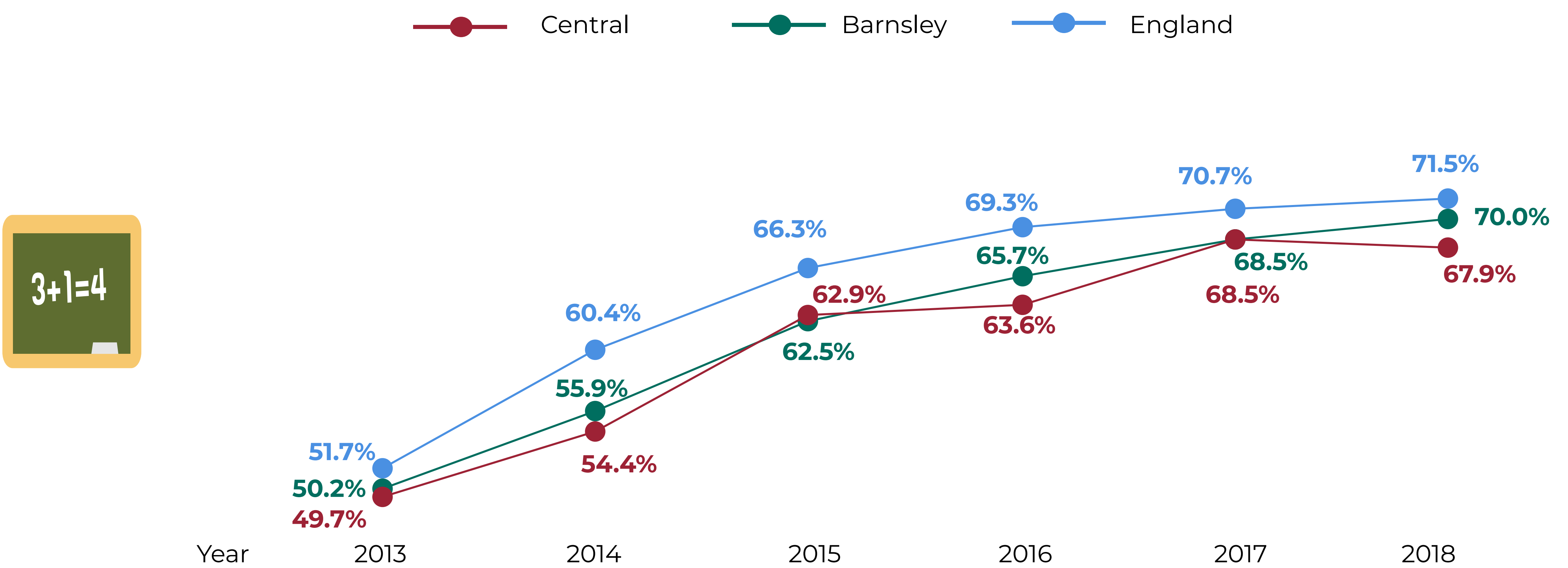

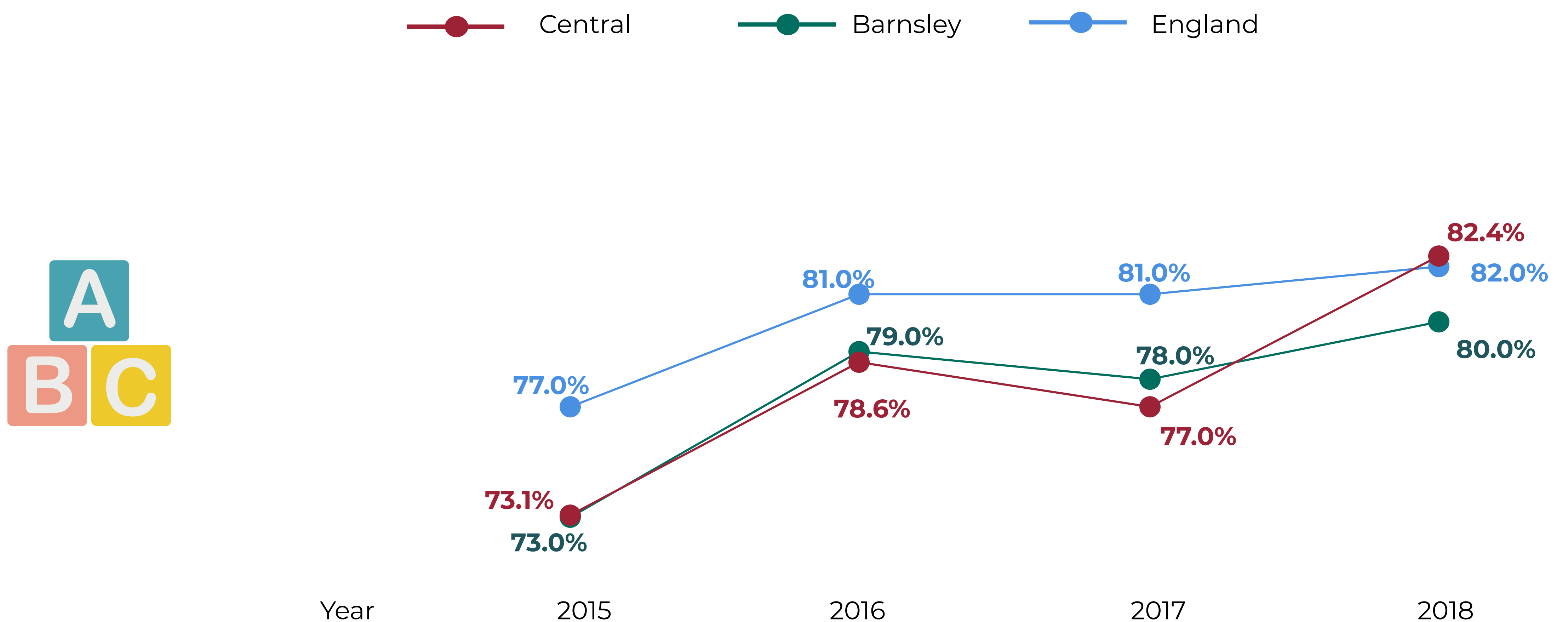

The percentage of pupils resident in Central area achieving a good level of development decreased in 2018 with outcomes now below both the Barnsley and national averages.

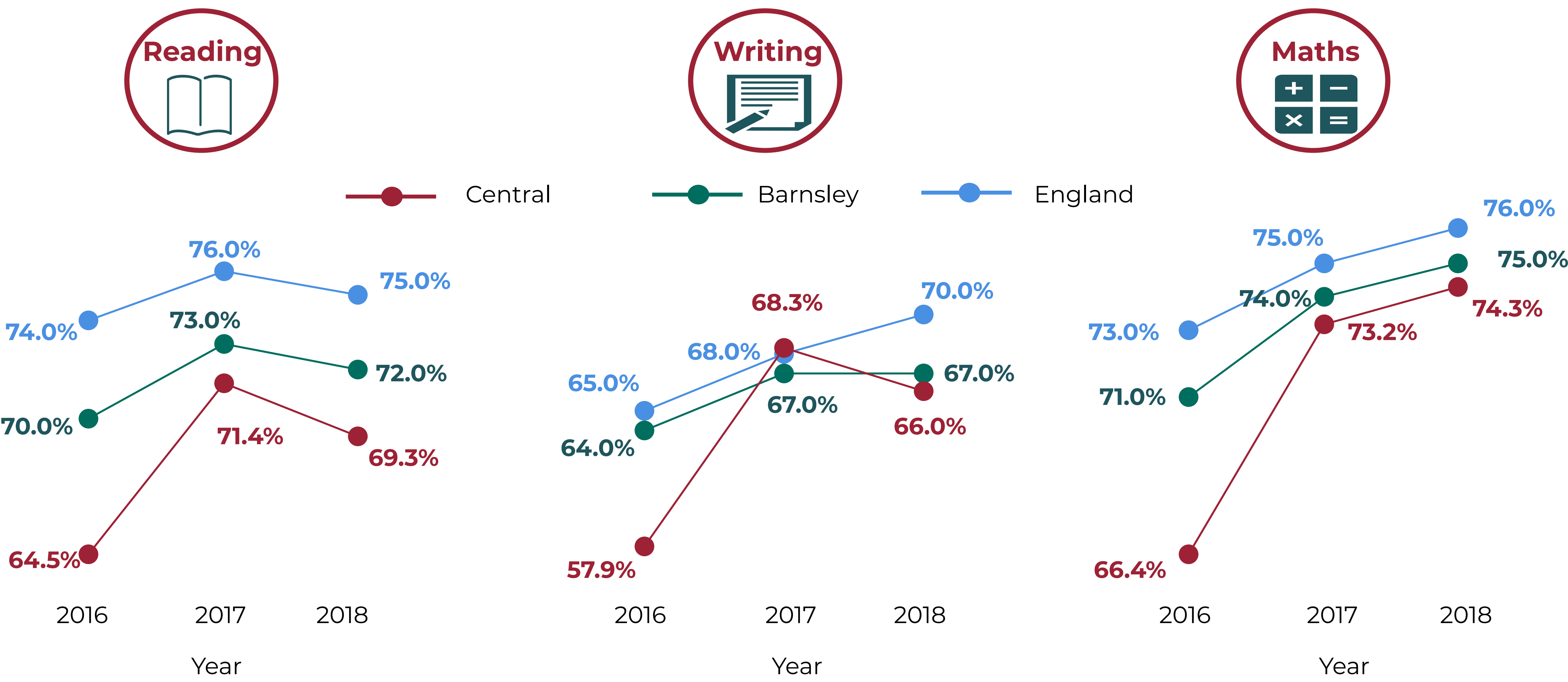
% of Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard in the Phonics Screening Check at the End of Year 1 2015 - 2018



The percentage of pupils resident in Central area achieving the expected standard in phonics screening increased in 2018 and is now above both the Barnsley and national averages.

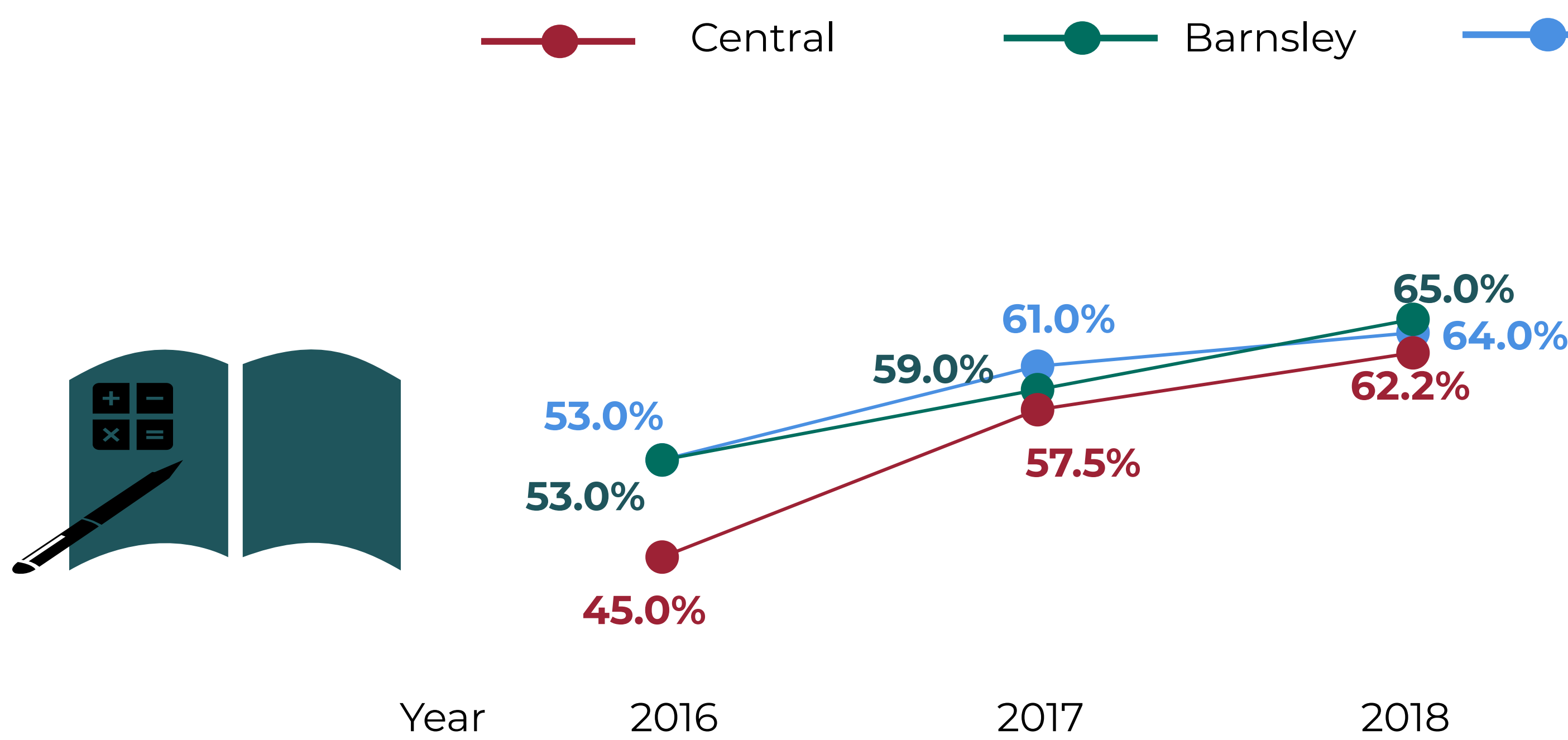

% of Key Stage 1 Pupils Achieving the Expected Standard 2016 - 2018



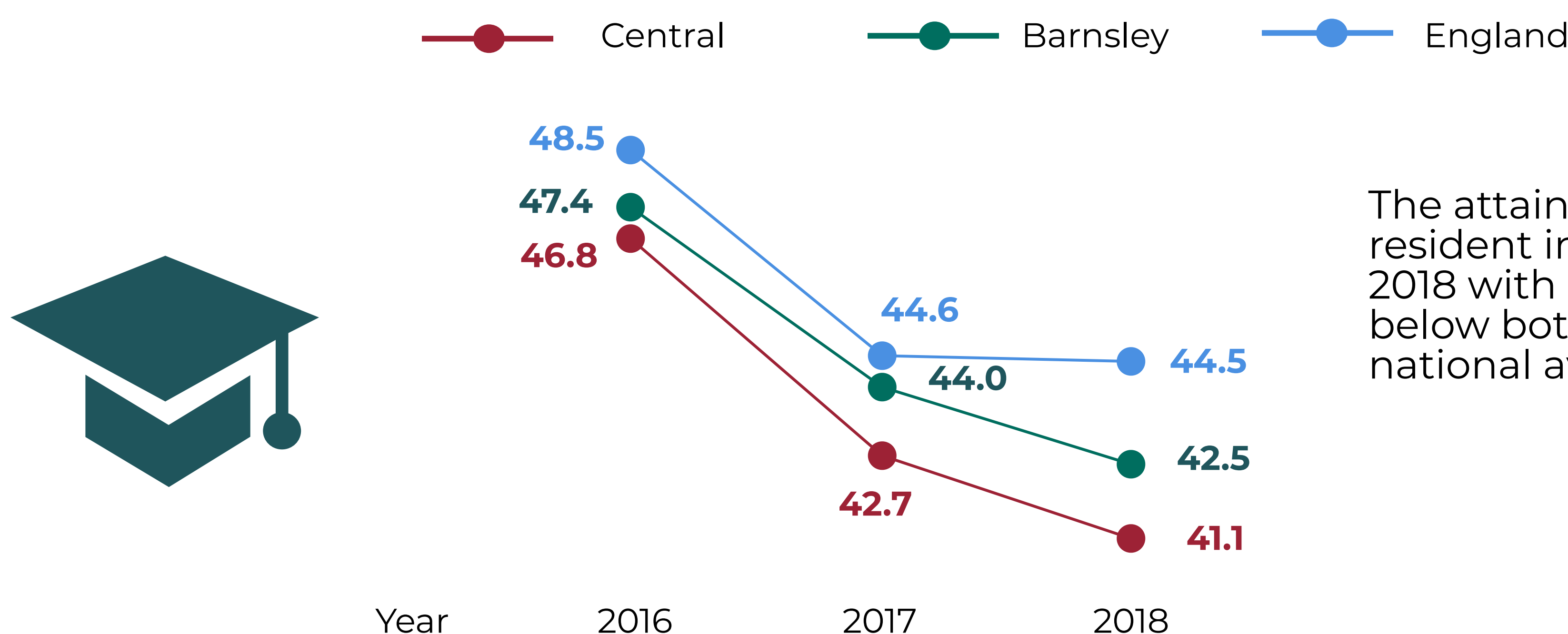

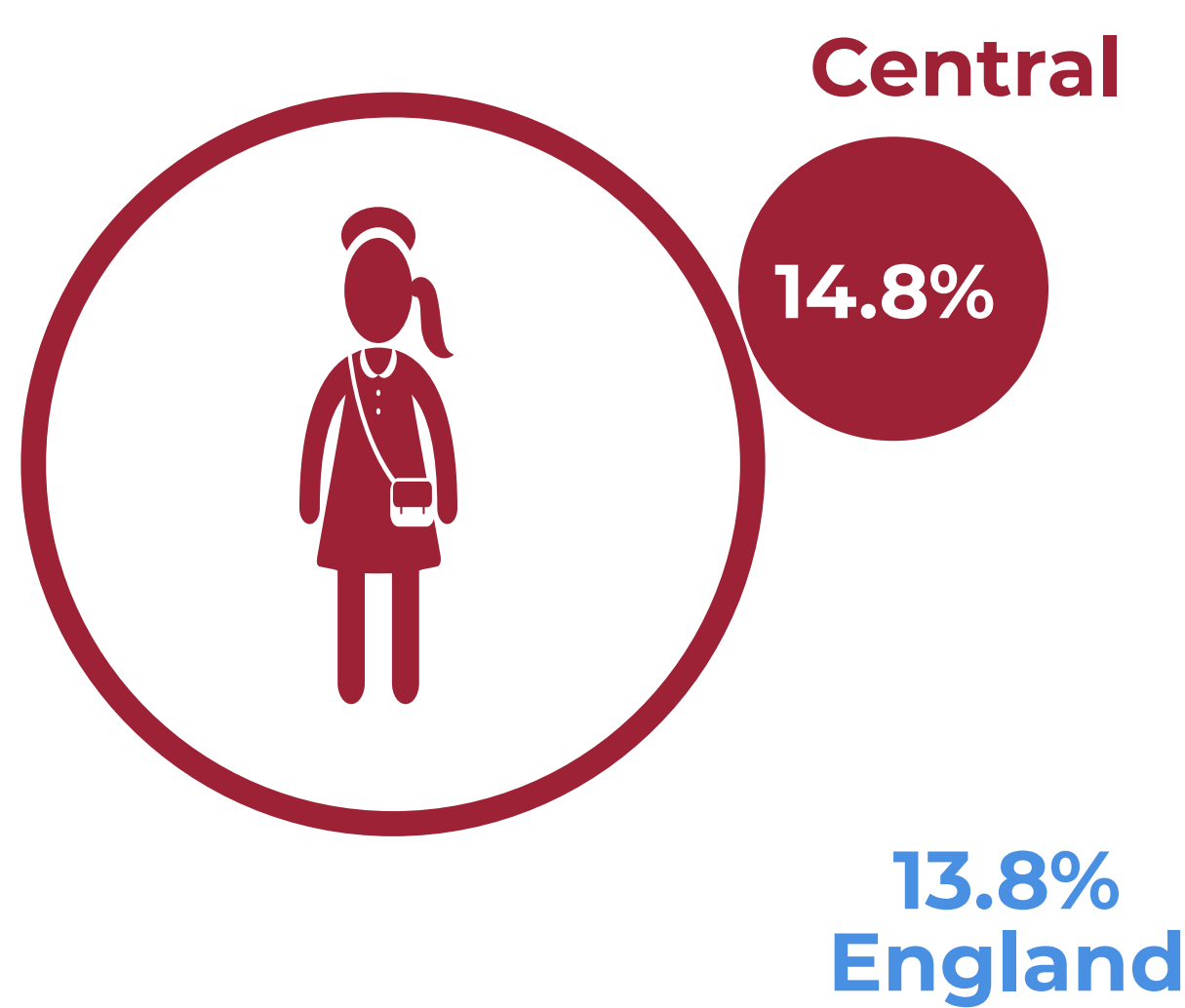


The percentage of secondary school pupils eligible for and claiming a free school meal in Central area decreased in 2018 but remained above both the Barnsley and national averages.

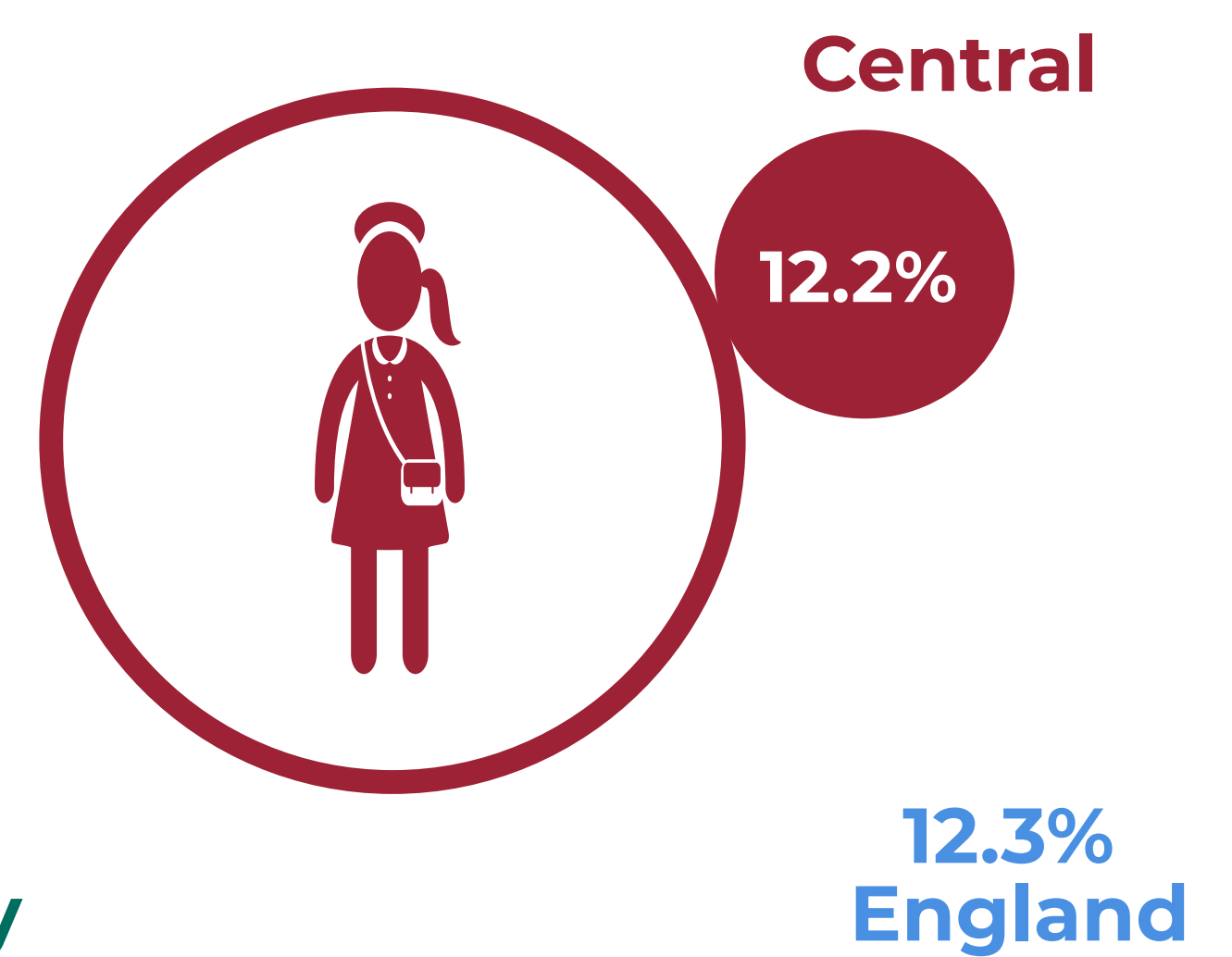
% of Pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities 2018

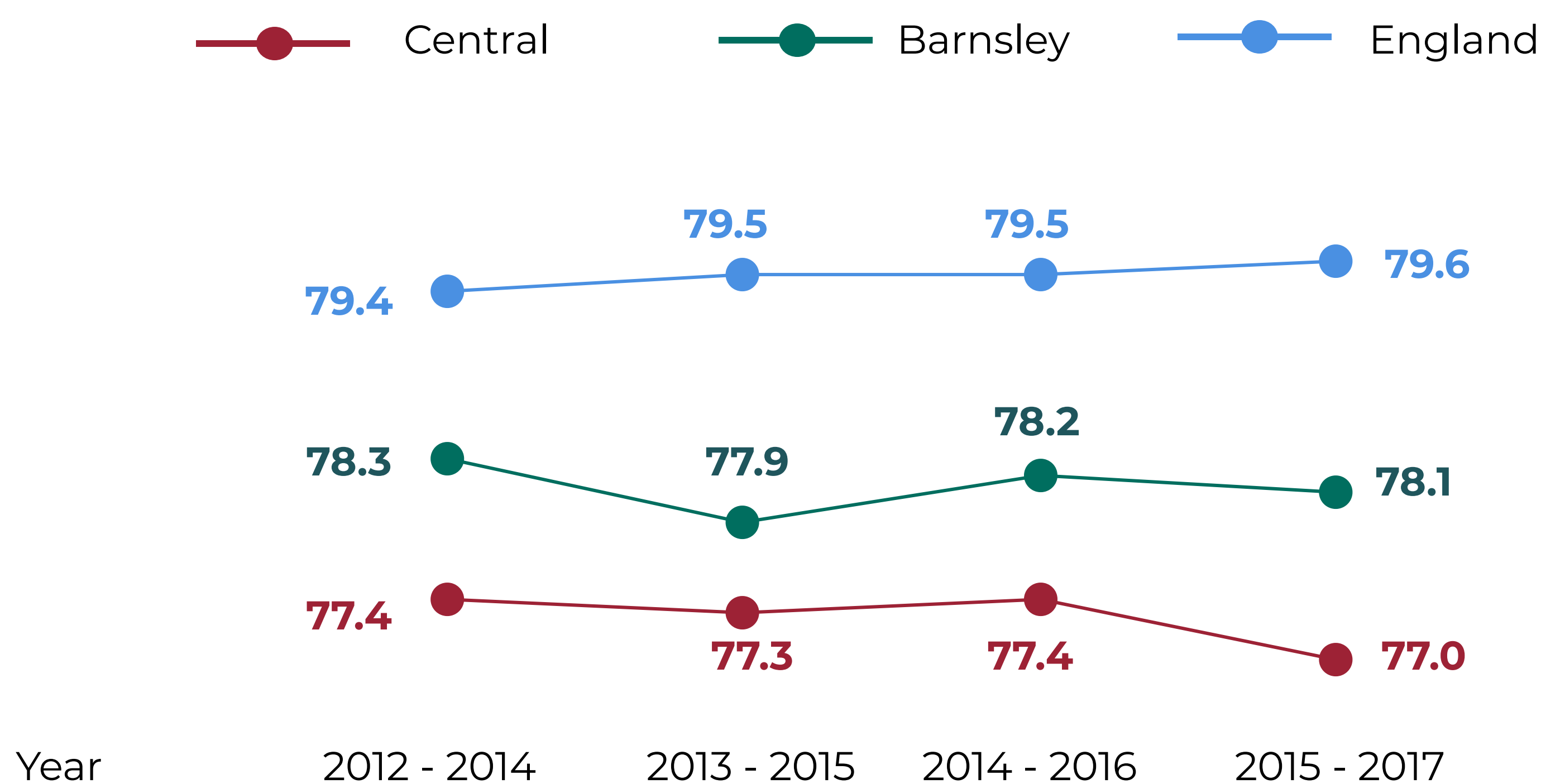


The percentage of secondary school pupils with special educational needs and disabilities in Central area increased in 2018 but remained below both the Barnsley and national averages.

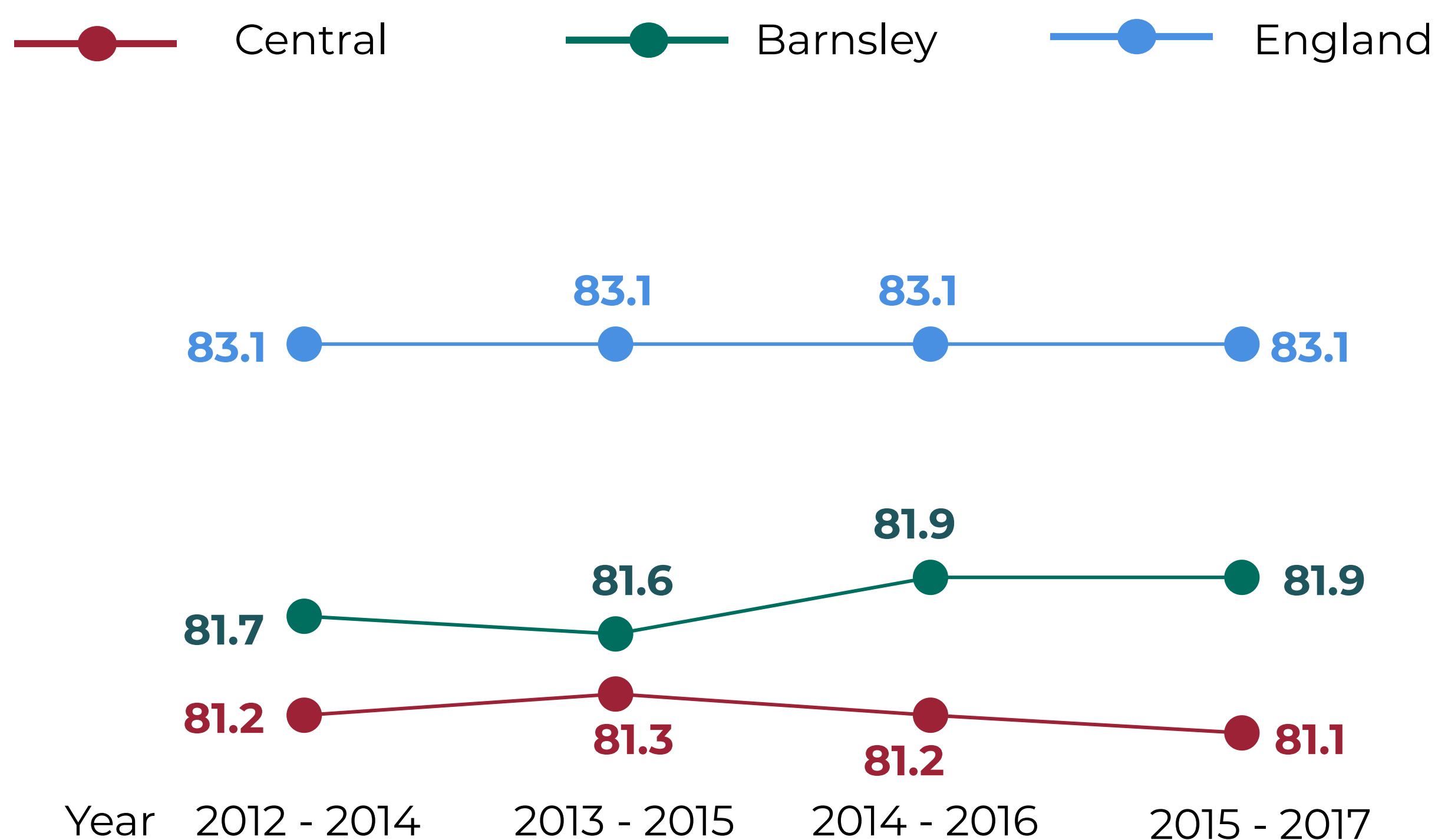
Life Expectancy at Birth

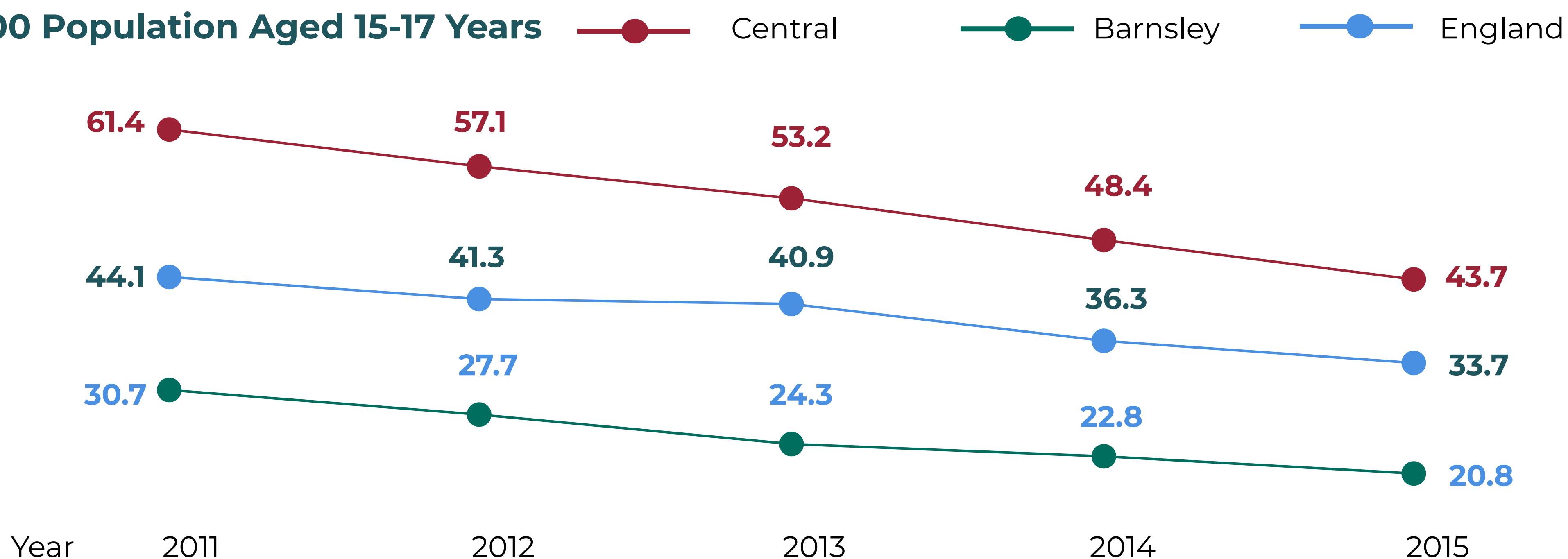
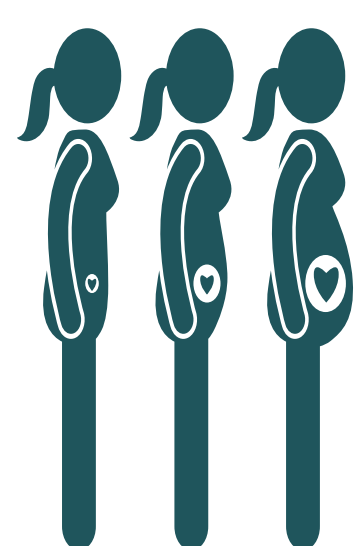
Female

Rate per 1,000 Population Aged 15-17 Years



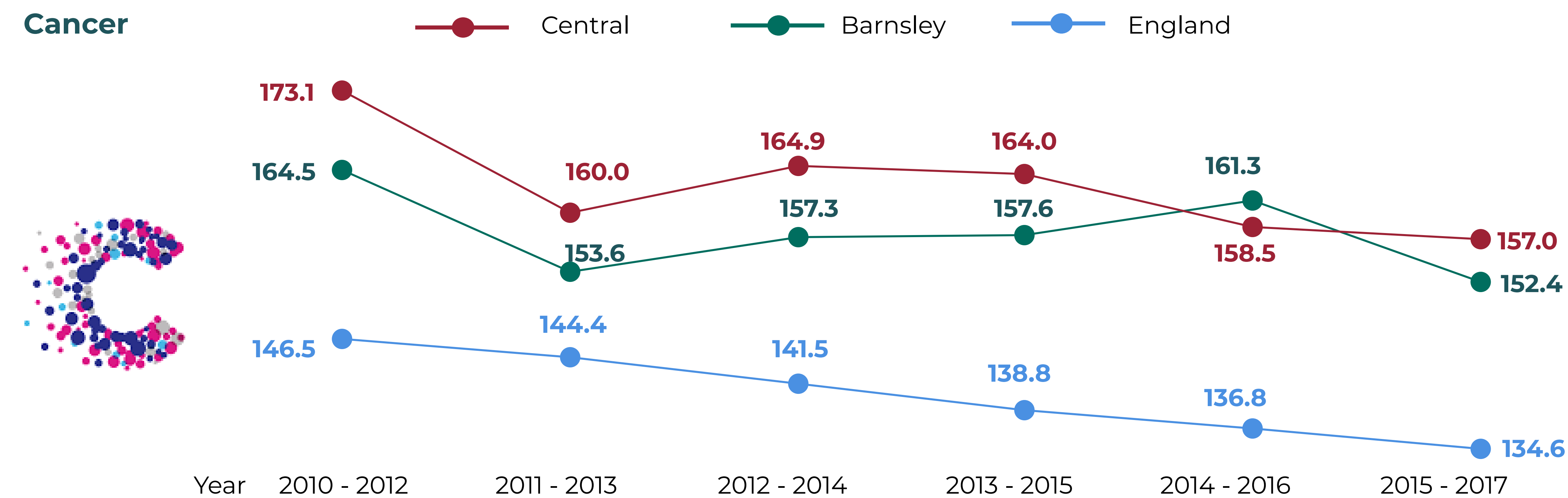

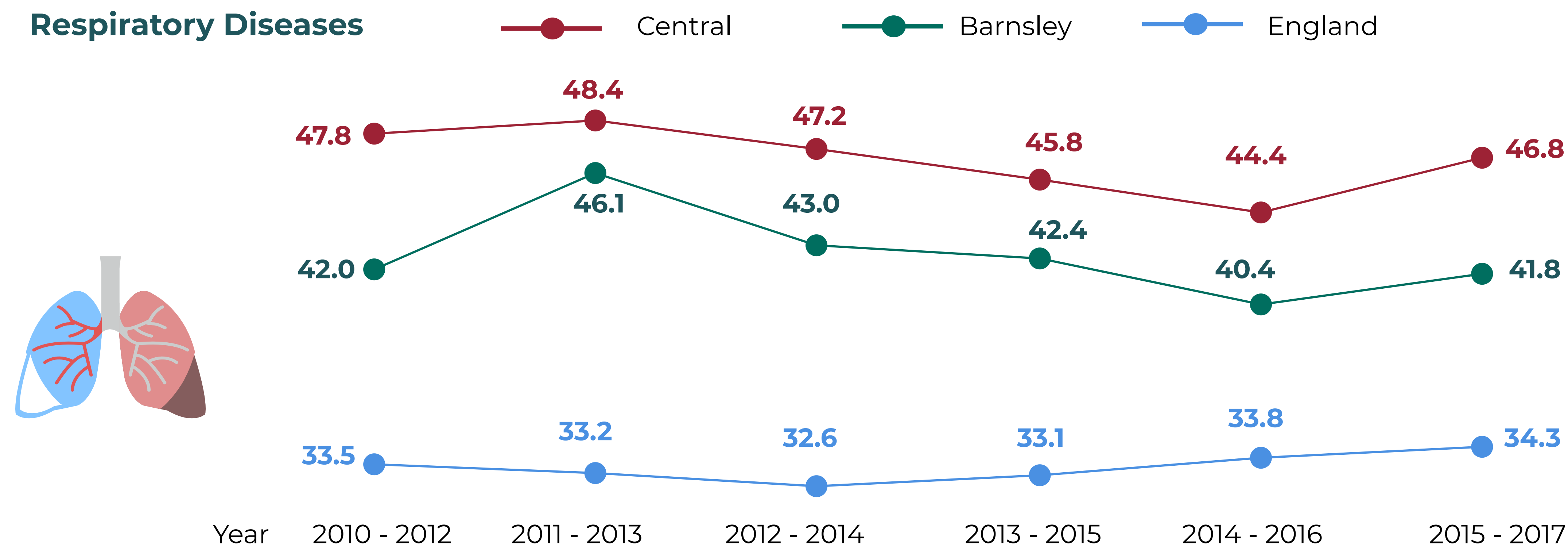

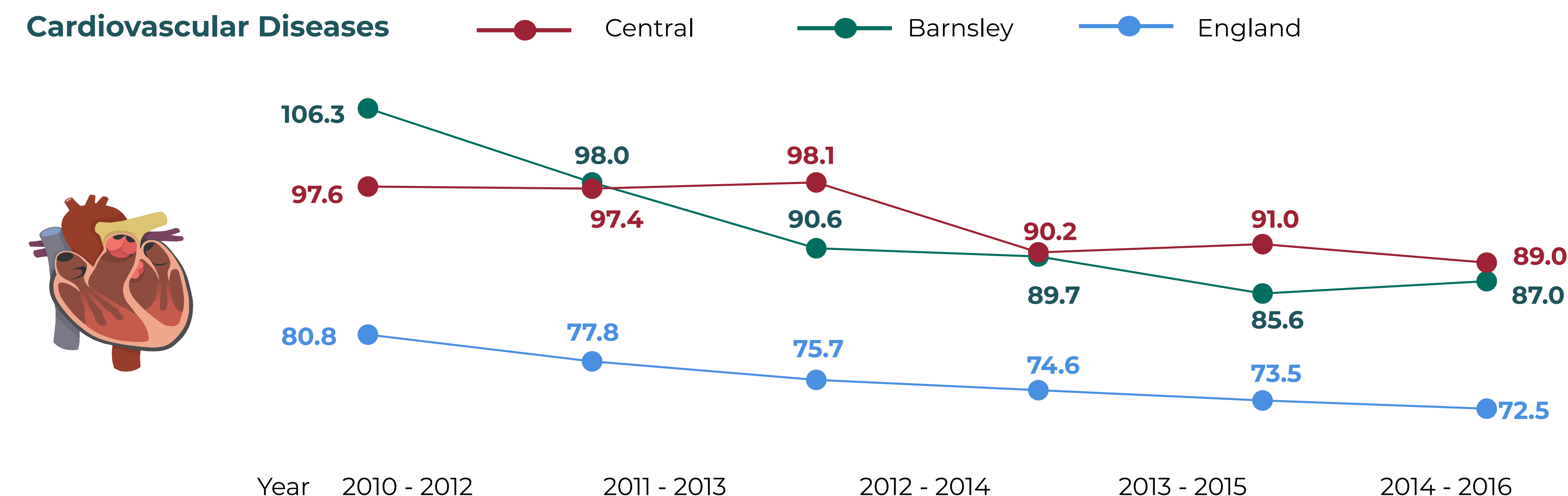
Under 75 Mortality (rate per 100,000 population)



Central area's under 75 cancer mortality rate (157.0 per 100,000) is higher than the Barnsley rate of 152.4. However, the current rate is the lowest during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017.



Under 75 mortality rates from respiratory diseases in Central area have been consistently higher than the rates in Barnsley at each time point during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017.

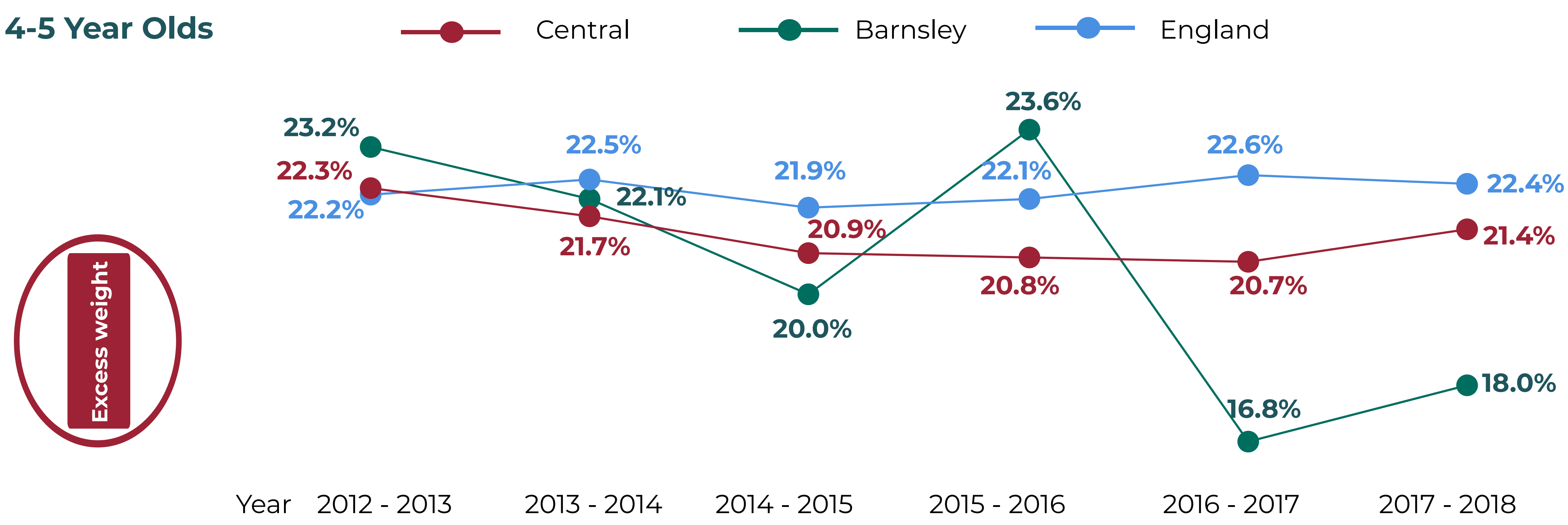


Under 75 mortality rates from cardiovascular diseases in Central area have fluctuated during the period 2010-2012 to 2015-2017. The current rate of 89.0 per 100,000, although higher than the Barnsley rate of 87.0, is the lowest it has been since 2010-2012.

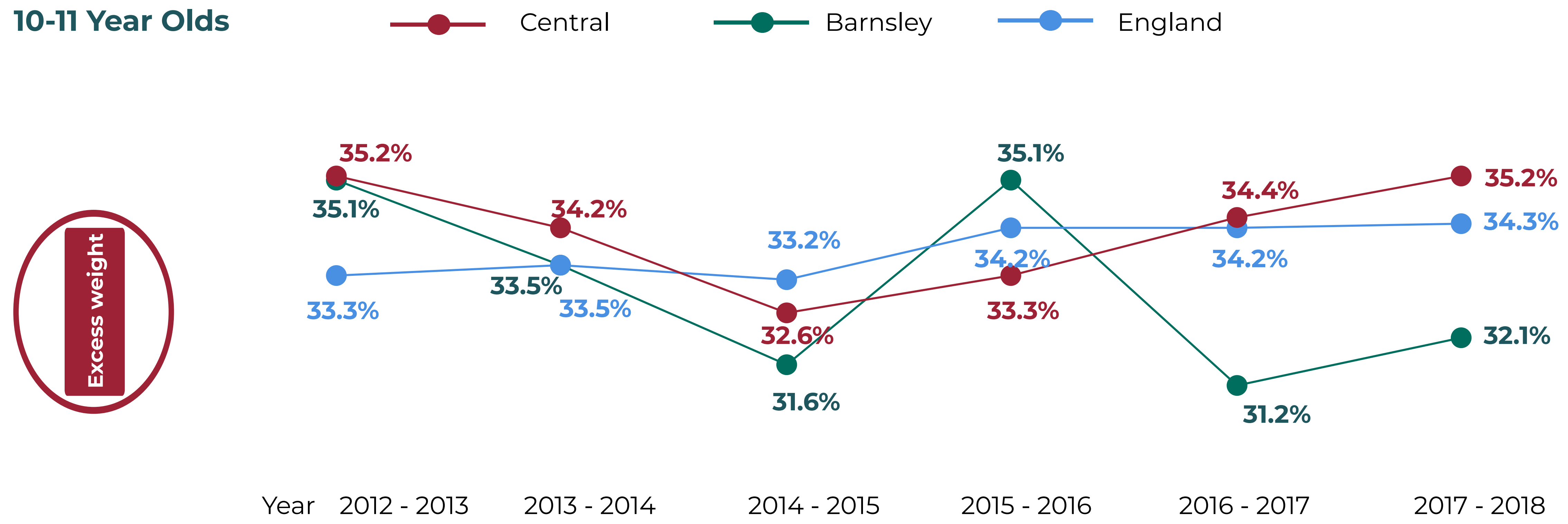
Excess weight

The proportion of 4-5 year olds in Central area who are overweight or obese (21.4%) is higher than the proportion in Barnsley overall (18.0%). The current rate is the higher than the previous year.

The proportion of 10-11 year olds in Central area who are overweight or obese (35.2%) is higher than the proportion in Barnsley overall (32.1%). Rates have fluctuated during the period 2012-2013 to 2017-2018.

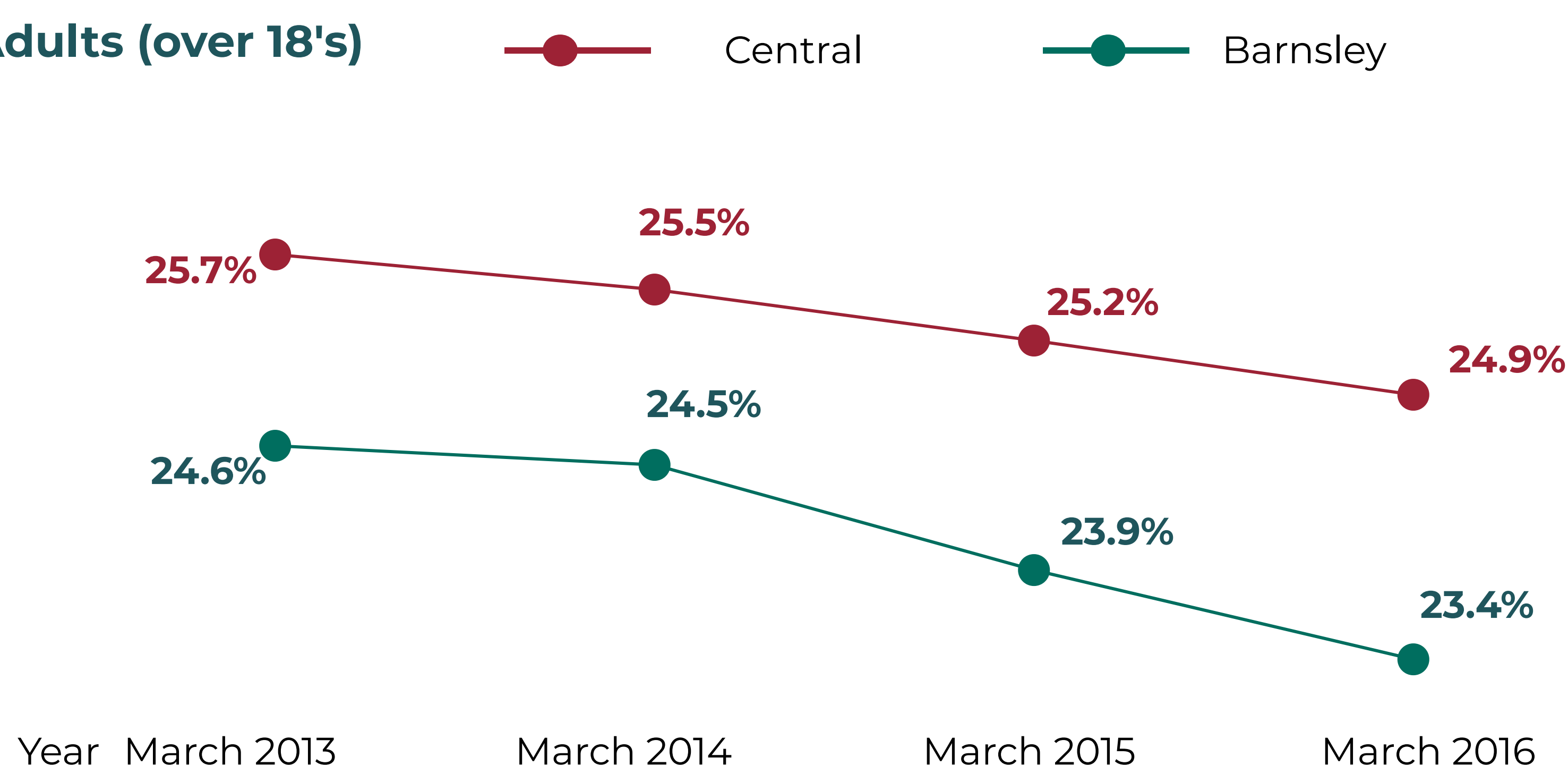
61.5% of women in Central area breastfeed their babies at birth; higher than the Barnsley rate of 55.6% and an increase from 56.5% in 2015/16.

Prevalence - Adults (over 18's)

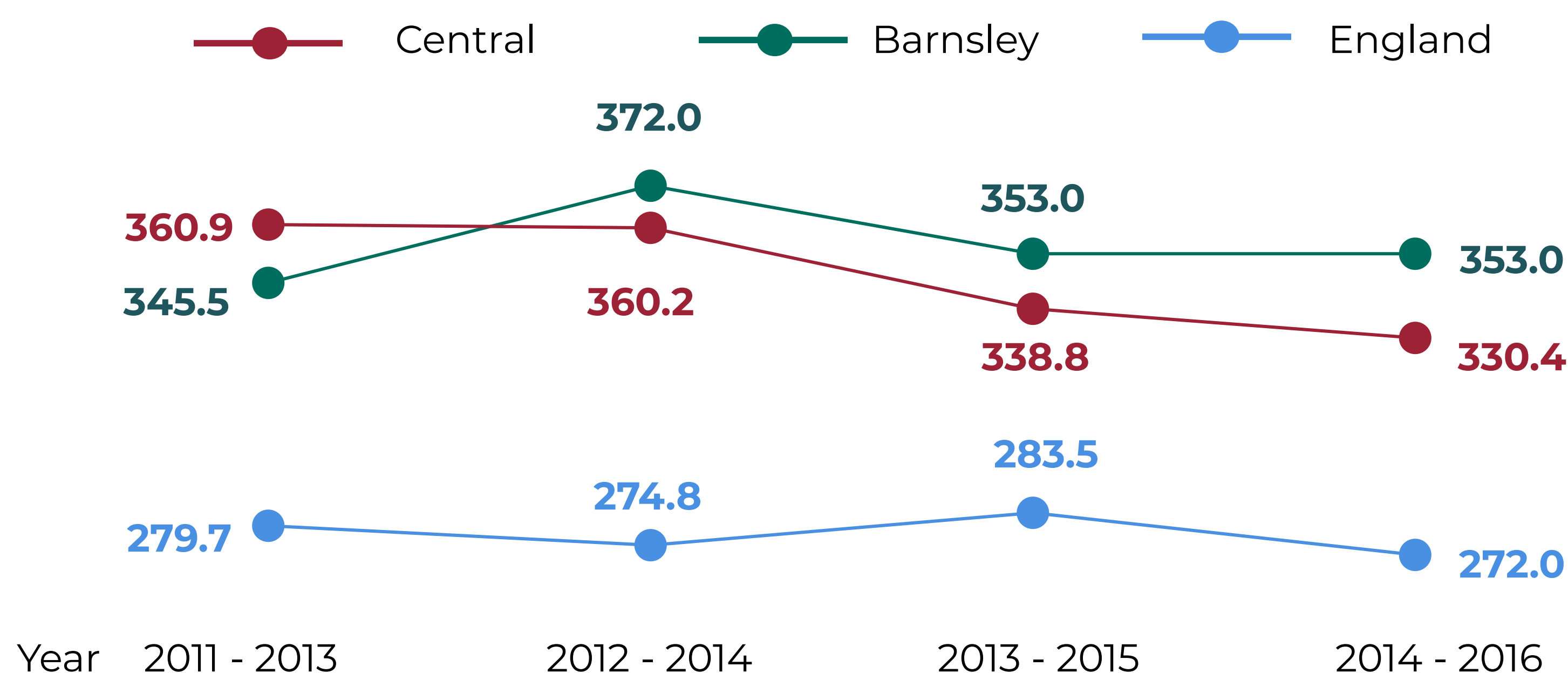
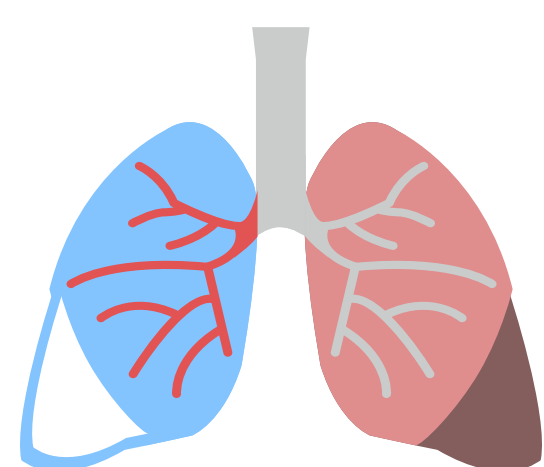


No England data available for smoking prevalence as the Area Council and Barnsley data has been calculated locally from GP records.

Almost one in four adults in Central area are smokers. Rates have been consistently higher than the Barnsley rates at each time point during the period 2013 to 2016. However, the current rate of 24.9% is the lowest since 2013.

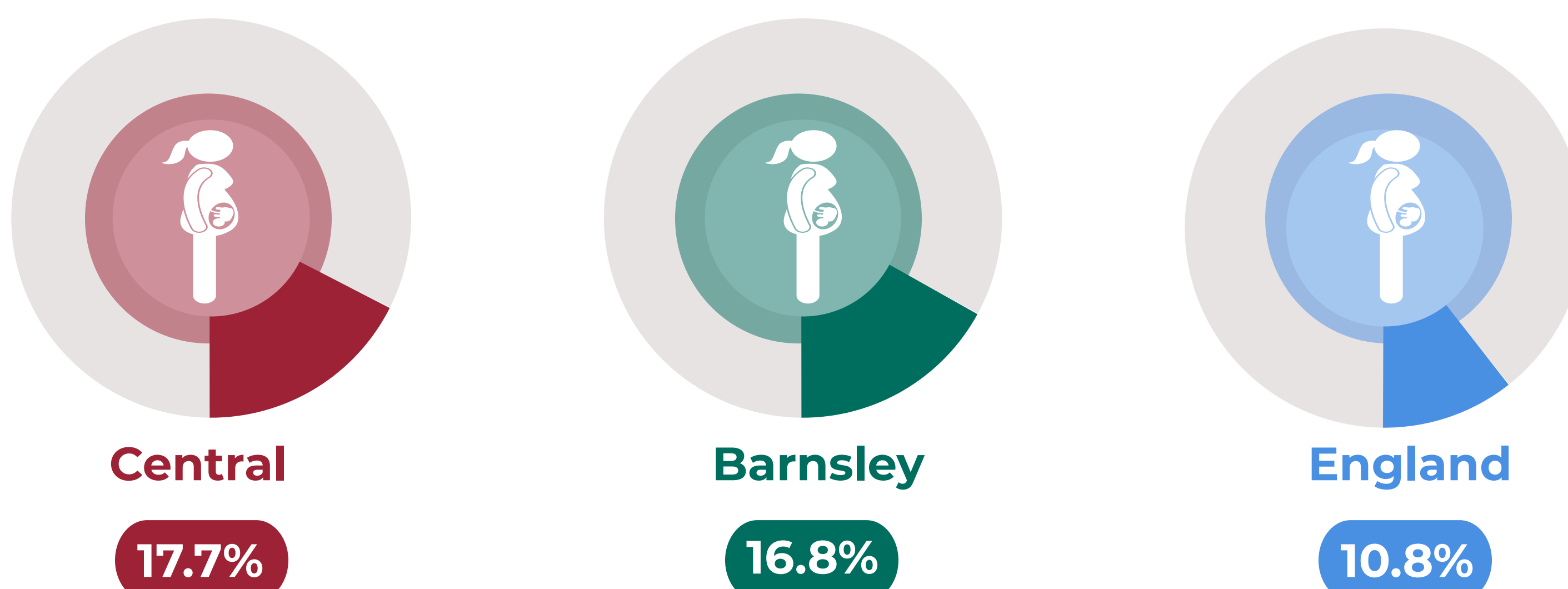
Related Deaths per 100,000 (Over 35's)



Central area's smoking related deaths rate (330.4 per 100,000 aged 35+) is lower than the Barnsley rate of 353.0 and is the lowest during the period 2011-2013 to 2014-2016.

Households

Residents Living Alone and Aged 65+ Years



The 2011 Census showed that 13.2% of the residents in Central area aged 65+ lived alone and could be at risk of social isolation. Rates are similar to those levels across Barnsley and nationally.

Housing Tenure

Owned



In 2011 6 in every 10 properties in Central area were owned with a mortgage or owned outright. Rates are similar to those levels across Barnsley and nationally.

Social Rented



There are a higher proportion of properties in Central area that are social rented when compared to rates in Barnsley and nationally.

Private Rented



In 2011 the proportion of all properties that were privately rented in Central area was higher than levels in Barnsley but slightly lower than nationally.

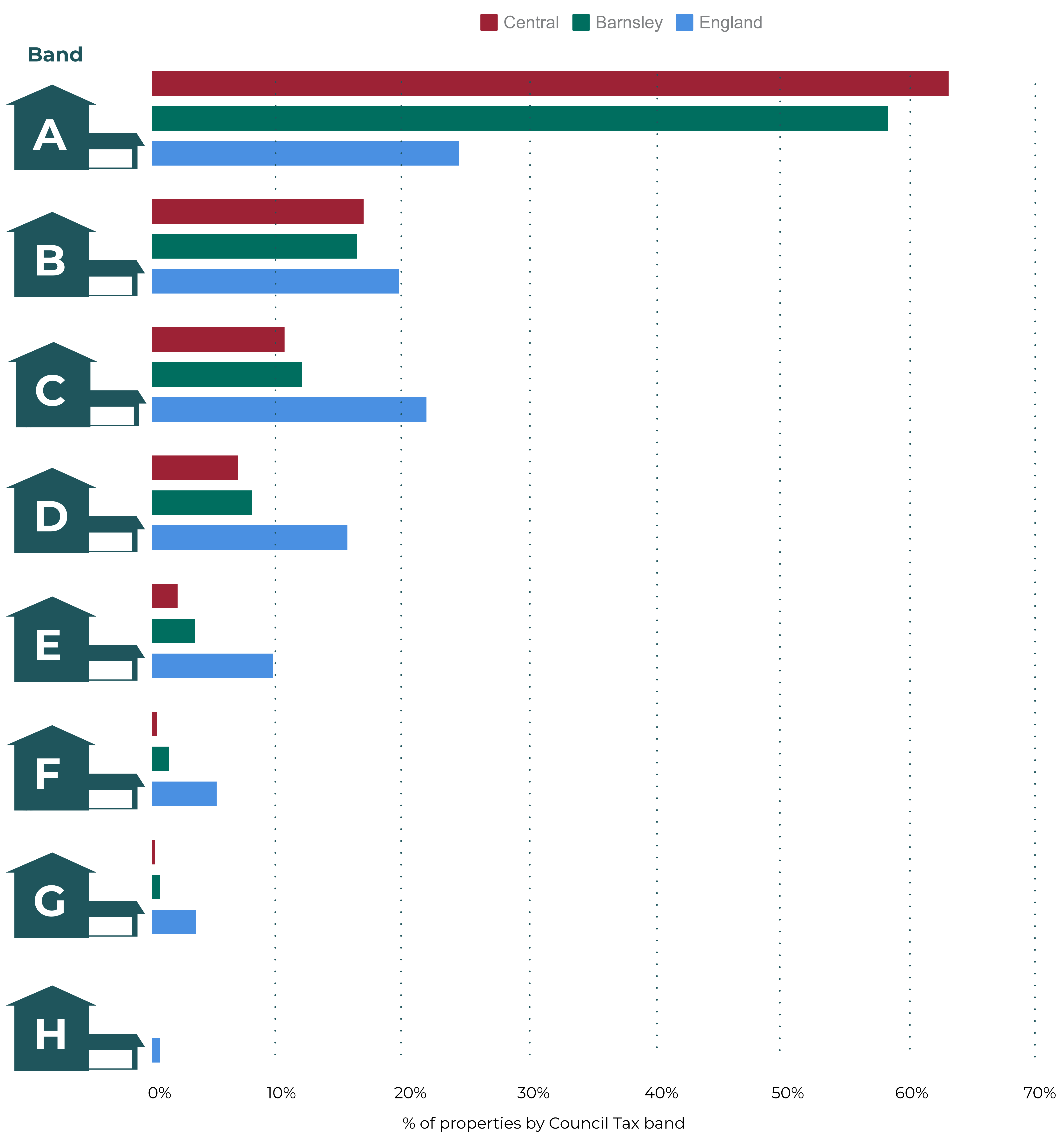

Total Crime (rate per 1,000 population)



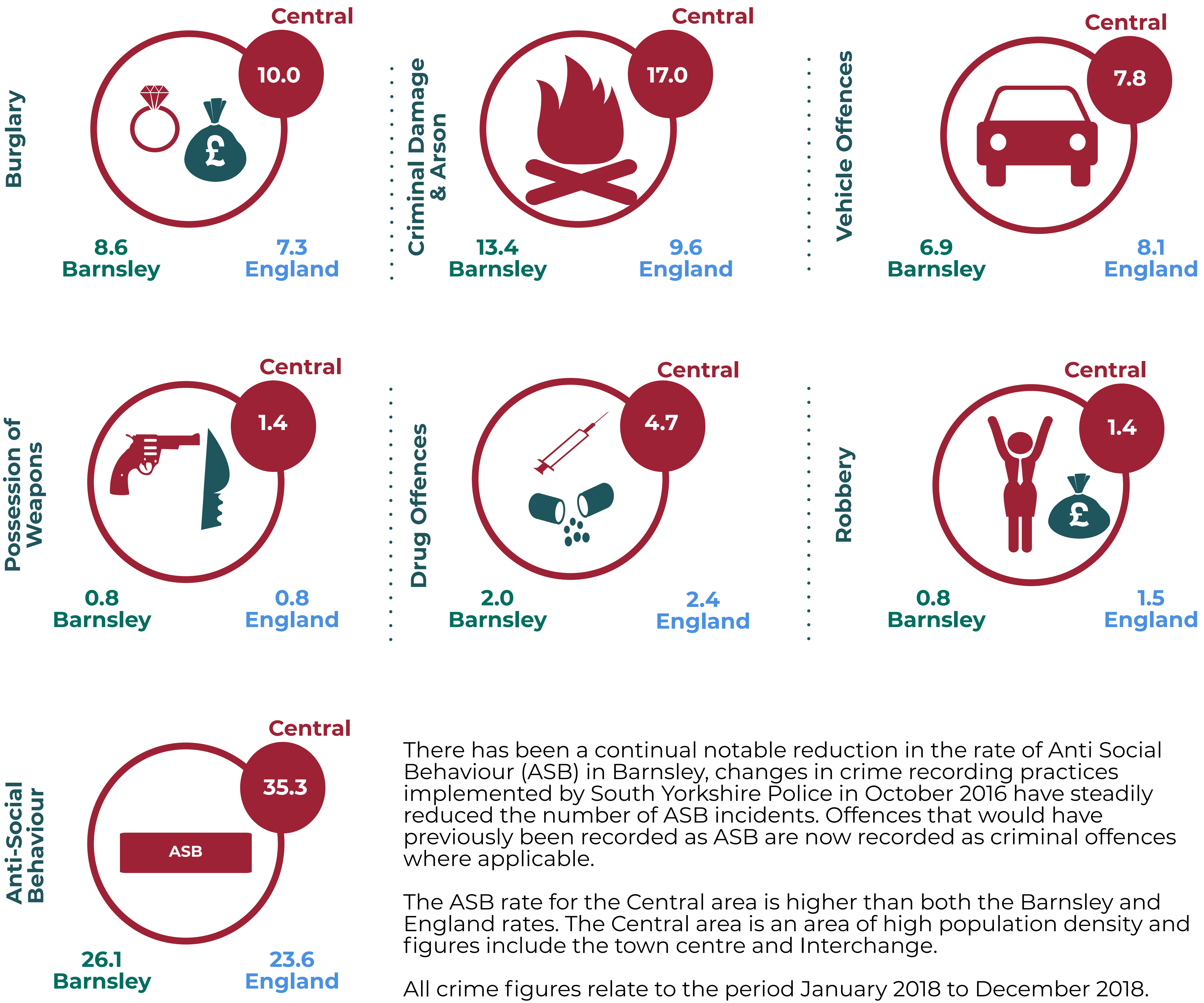

There has been a continual notable reduction in the rate of Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) in Barnsley, changes in crime recording practices implemented by South Yorkshire Police in October 2016 have steadily reduced the number of ASB incidents. Offences that would have previously been recorded as ASB are now recorded as criminal offences where applicable.

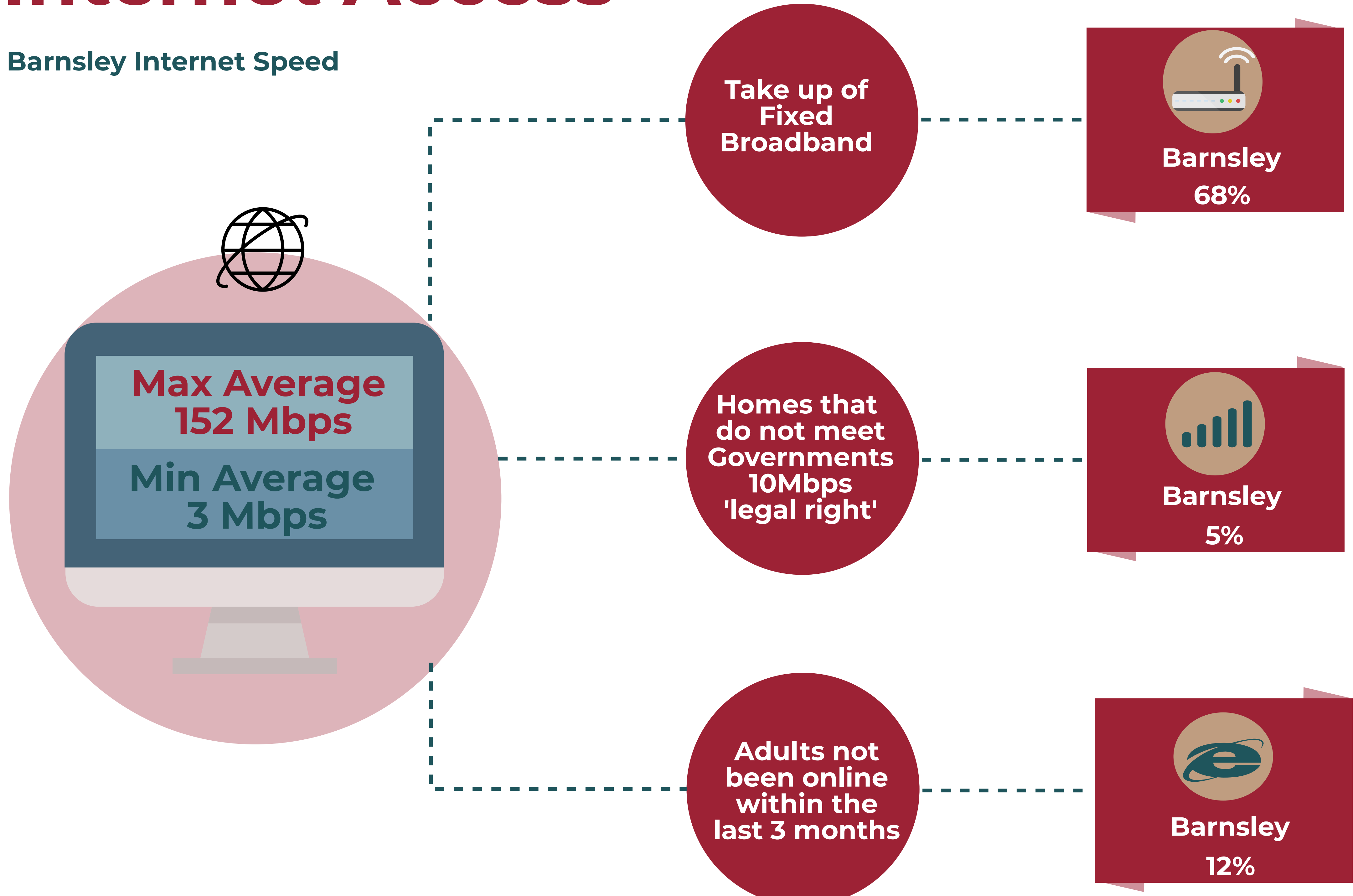
The ASB rate for the Central area is higher than both the Barnsley and England rates. The Central area is an area of high population density and figures include the town centre and Interchange.

All crime figures relate to the period January 2018 to December 2018.

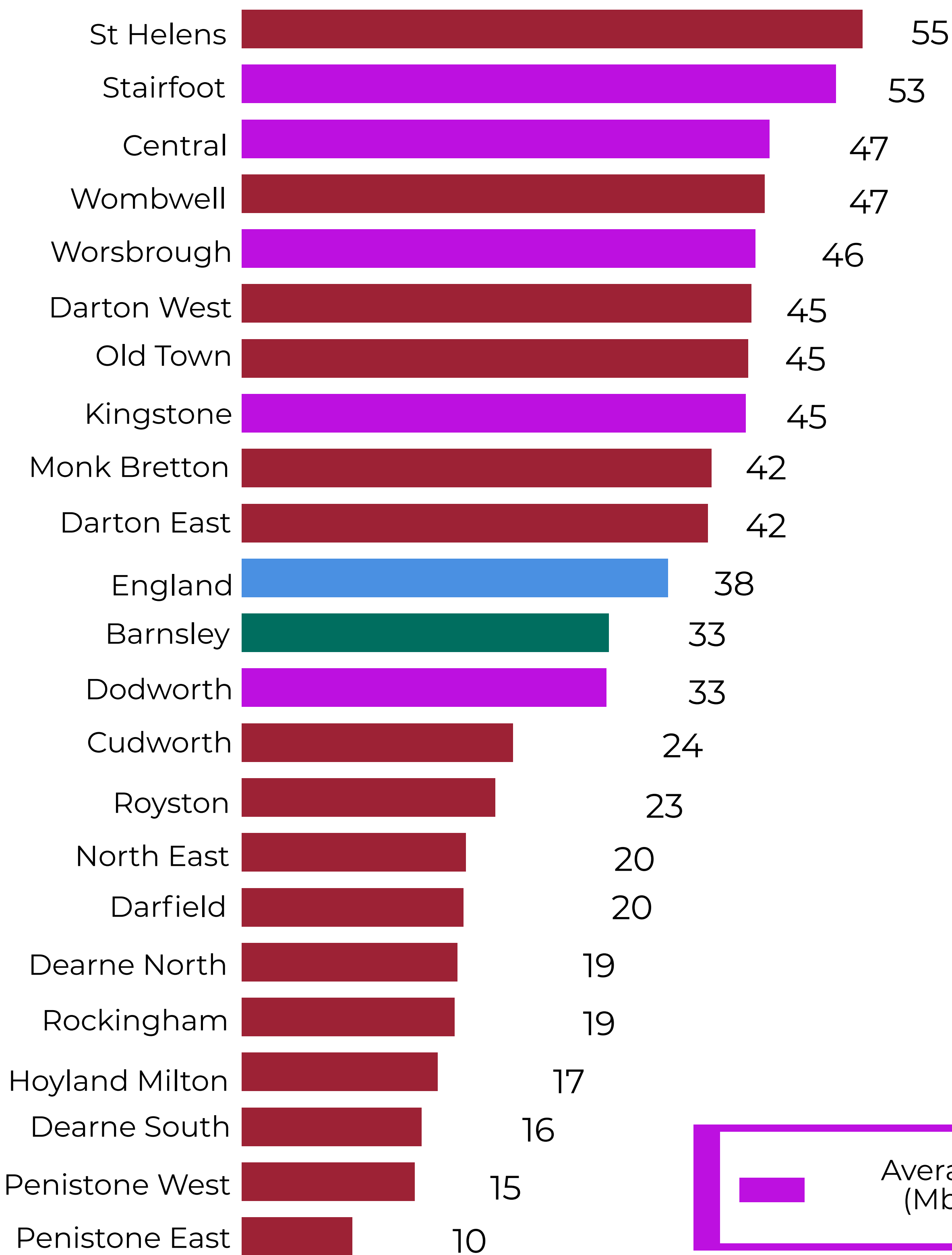

Barnsley Internet Speed



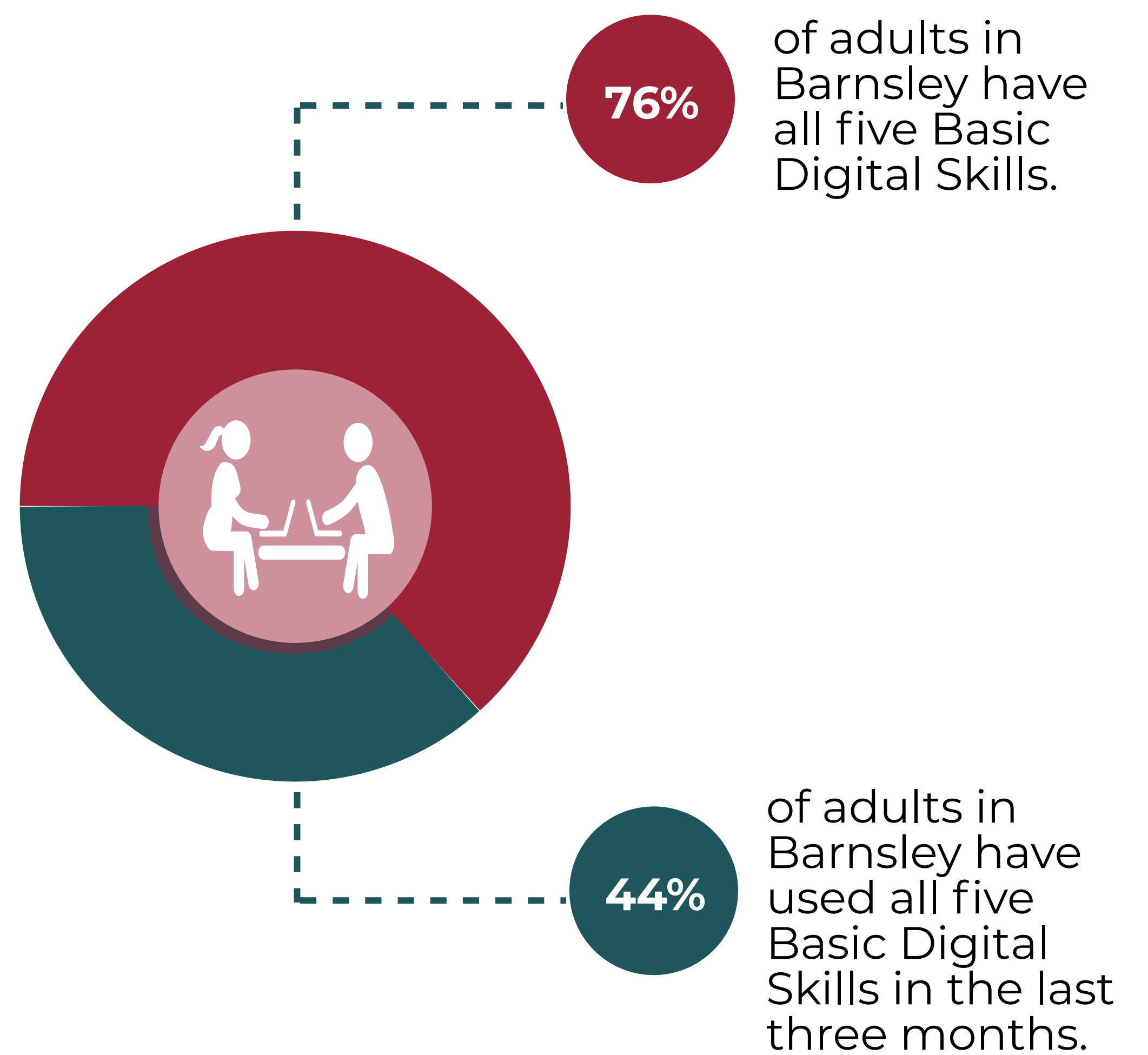
Average Speed by Ward (Mbps)

- Being safe and legal online

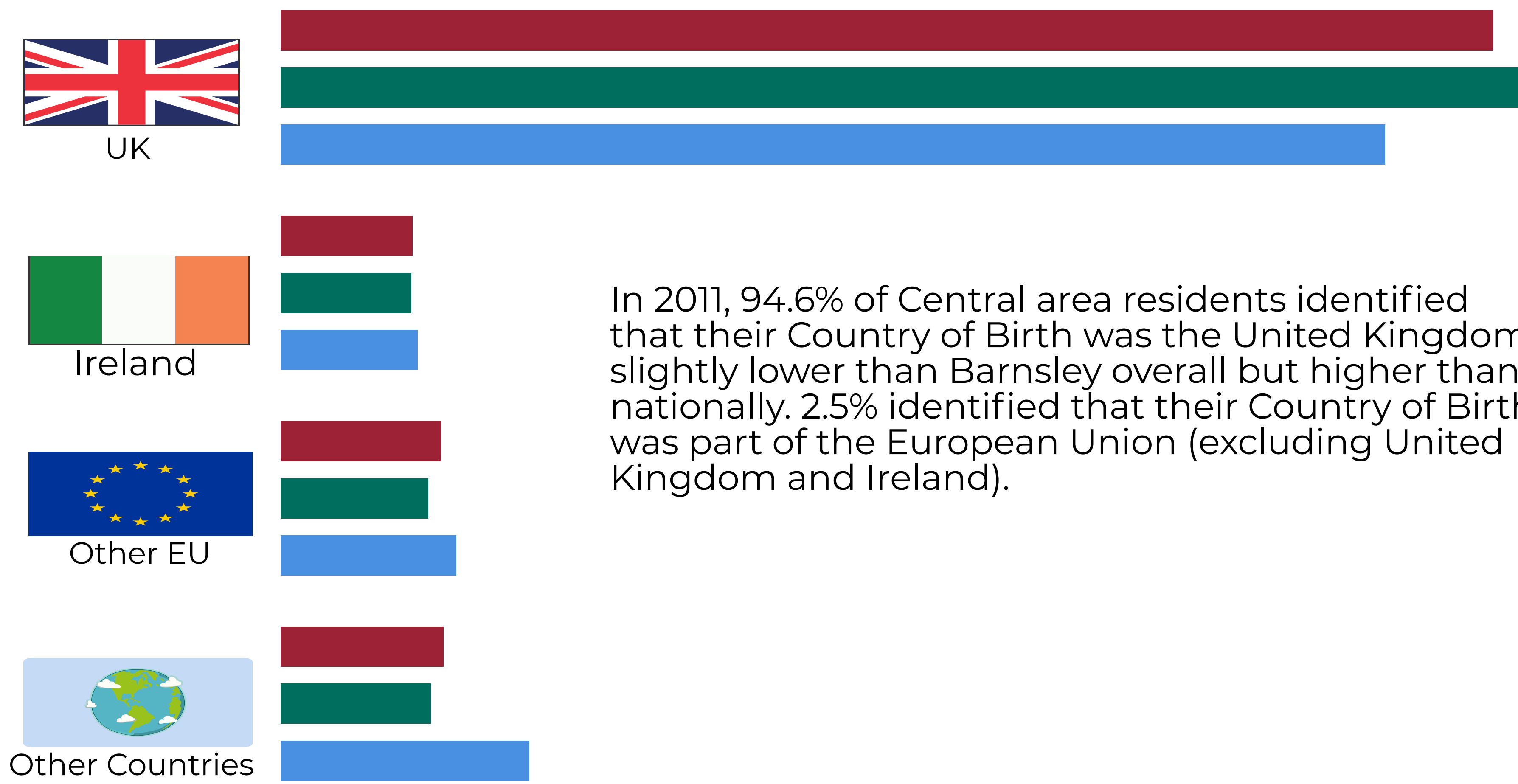


Average Speed by Wards (Mbps) in Central area

Excess Winter Deaths Index

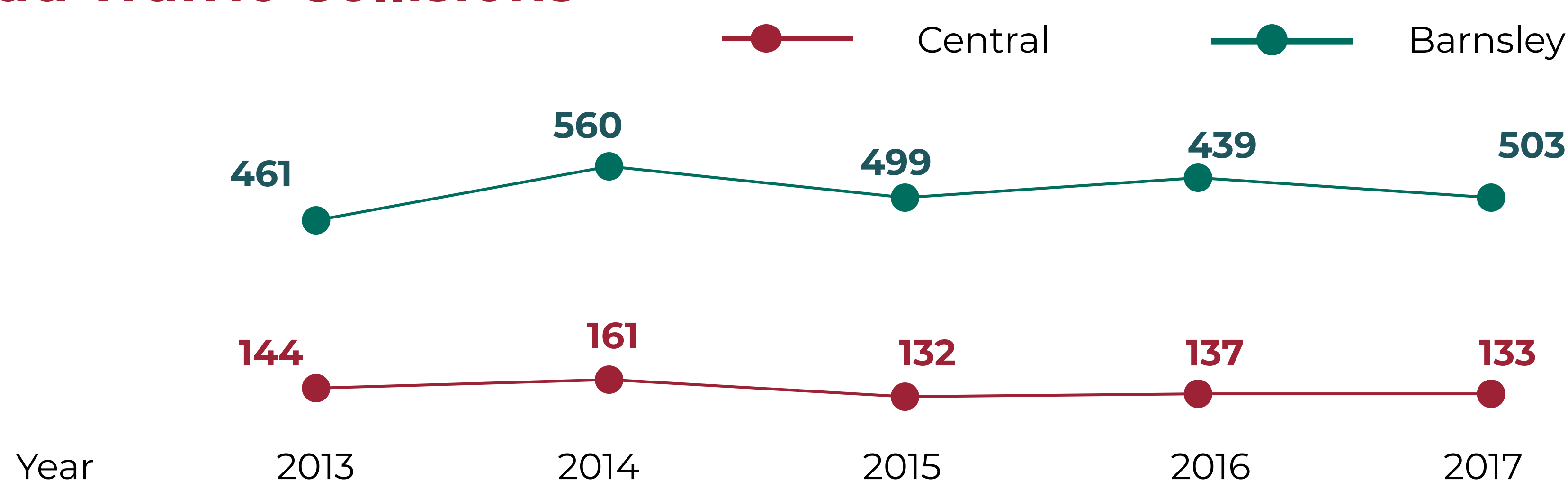


Central area's Excess Winter Deaths rate is lower than that of Barnsley but higher than the England rate.

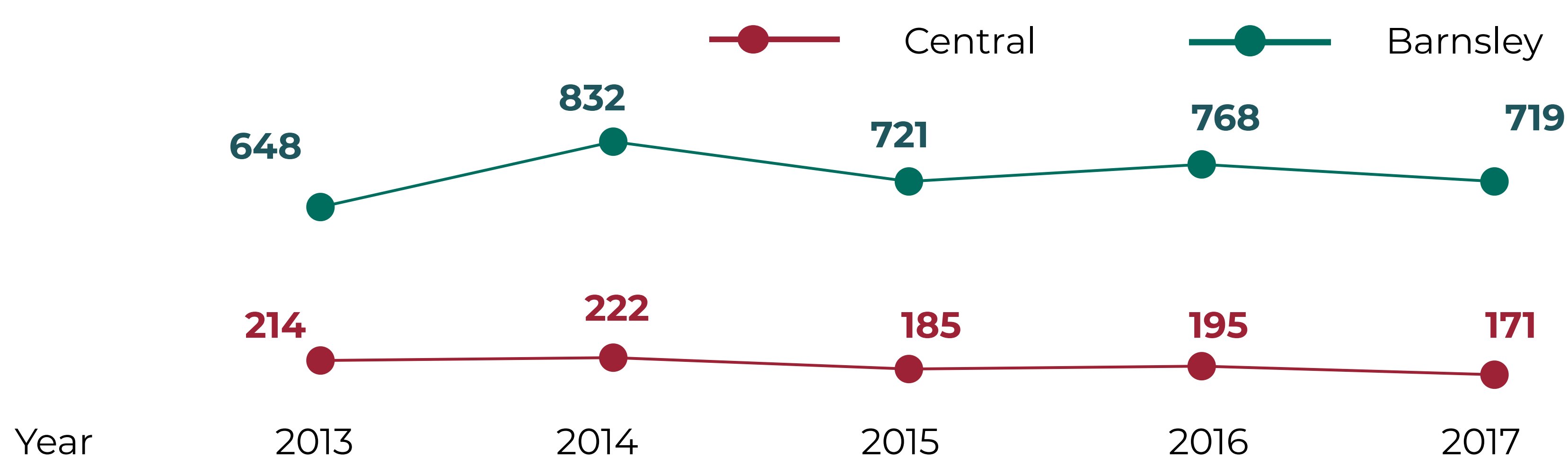
Other
