# Comprehensive support plan for pensioners

In Barnsley, we understand the pressure rising costs are placing on residents, in particular, our elderly residents and we're committed to providing support everyone needs to stay warm and well this winter.

In response to the recent changes to the Winter Fuel Allowance, which is now limited to people receiving Pension Credit or other low-income benefits, we're taking active steps to protect and support our communities.

We're using the Household Support Fund, funded by the Government, to help residents who may not qualify for the Winter Fuel Allowance, so that no one is left without essential help during the colder months.

Recognising the need for action, Barnsley councillors passed a motion calling for a review of the Winter Fuel Allowance eligibility criteria. While understanding the need for change, there are concerns about the exclusion of people who do not qualify for Pension Credit but are still on low incomes and facing financial hardship. We're writing to the Government, urging them to reconsider and expand the eligibility requirements for this critical allowance.

We're aware that many eligible people in Barnsley have yet to claim Pension Credit. This is money they're entitled to, and it could make a real difference this winter. That's why we've launched a borough-wide campaign to boost Pension Credit uptake, ensuring no one misses out on this vital benefit.

Additionally, we're making use of the Government's Household Support Fund to help people who may not qualify for the Winter Fuel Allowance under the new rules. We're working with community groups across the borough to ensure everyone gets the help they need.

- Boost your immunity by getting your flu jab or Covid vaccine if you're eligible.
- Check in on your family, friends and neighbours during cold weather, particularly older people, and ask if they need any help, like something picking up from the shops.

## Sustainable makeovers for our community centres

#### Sustainability is at the heart of our work to improve our community centres across Barnsley.

We want everyone to have access to high-quality facilities but are also committed to ensuring these vital venues are energy-efficient and fit for the future.

Under our Principal Towns and Local Centres Programme, we're improving much-loved centres

around the borough. The aim is to modernise and revitalize them while reducing running costs and boosting sustainability.

Mapplewell Village Hall and Library has seen a major £350,000 overhaul with a range of improvements.

These included new LED lighting and installed a new energy-saving boiler and heating system.

We also updated and enhanced the library in the same building as part of our Libraries Refurbishment Programme.

Wombwell Town Football Club is now undergoing its own upgrade.

Alongside electrical works and a new decking area, new solar panels are being installed to reduce energy costs.

Great Houghton Miners' Welfare Hall is also benefiting from a major

refurbishment. This includes the installation of LED lighting, a new roof, and kitchen renovations.

These works will improve energy efficiency and ensure the hall remains a valuable community asset for years to come.

This initiative underscores Sustainable Barnsley, our commitment under the Barnsley 2030 programme to create sustainable communities with reduced carbon emissions.

## Dearne Playhouse

### transformed by grand restoration







#### The Dearne Playhouse in Goldthorpe is welcoming back audiences and creative groups following extensive renovations supported by the UK Government's Towns Fund.

Originally the community's Miners' Welfare Hall, the Playhouse has been transformed into a modern, accessible cultural hub, while preserving its historic character.

The refurbishment has included adapting the basement previously used for storage – into multiple rehearsal rooms and a soundproofed music rehearsal studio.

redecorated, a new stage floor installed, and dressing rooms and backstage areas upgraded.

The ground floor has been fully

Stonework around the entrance has been restored and energy-efficient LED lighting and a new boiler installed. We've also fitted exterior CCTV for enhanced security.

The Playhouse, a valued community asset, is now fully accessible, thanks to the addition of a walkway and a new entrance to the basement.

Fresh creative opportunities are already being taken: the newlyformed Dearne Playhouse

> Musical Theatre Company will operate from the basement, while Barnsley Youth

Theatre is launching a new branch there.

The Playhouse's traditional pantomime is also making a return, with Snow White to be staged from 19 to 22 December.

Theatre manager Julie Medlam, said: "We can't wait to raise the curtain on a new era for our muchloved theatre."

Our Major Projects Team oversaw the works, which were carried out by O&P Construction.

Neighbouring Welfare Park, home to Dearne and District Football Club, is also benefitting from the investment, with resurfaced access roads, restored pathways, new public artwork, and plans for a 72-space car park.

This initiative is part of the Goldthorpe Town Deal, a package of major projects in Goldthorpe, Thurnscoe and Bolton upon Dearne funded by £23.1 million from the Towns Fund.

We've already delivered the new Horse and Groom Town Square in the heart of Goldthorpe. New sustainable housing is being brought forward in Goldthorpe and a new community hub is planned for Phoenix Park in Thurnscoe.

**Towns Fund investment supports** our work under our Principal Towns and Local Centres Programme to helping local high streets and communities across the borough to thrive.

This is known as 'deconditioning'.

The Eat, Drink, Dress, Move initiative is a therapy-led approach to care which supports patients to actively participate in their recovery.

For most patients staying in hospital, this will be getting dressed, eating well, staying hydrated and moving around.

The benefits of keeping active whilst in hospital have been clearly demonstrated by research and audits.

Benefits include helping patients get back to their own homes, reducing complications associated with dehydration, and maintaining physical skills for independence.

Family, friends and carers can all help by bringing in suitable snacks, day clothes and supportive footwear, and encouraging loved ones in hospital to have a sip of a drink.

Please check with healthcare staff on the ward if you have any questions or concerns.

## Think before you bin it

### Recycling plays an important role in protecting our environment.

Batteries and electrical items are commonly hidden in many in everyday items including:

- remote controls
- toys
- vapessmoke alarms
- electric scooters
- shavers
- mobile phones and laptops.

#### Don't put electrical items in the grey bin.

Please do not put vapes or batteries in your grey bin.

All batteries and electrical products should display the 'crossed out wheelie bin'. This means they should be taken to a suitable collection point and not put in your bin.

Batteries contain hazardous materials and if not recycled currently can explode when crushed and lead to fires in our collection vehicles and recycling centres.

#### Where can I recycle batteries?

Take them to our recycling centres. These are open seven days a week, find our nearest centre by visiting barnsley.gov.uk/HWRC.

Supermarkets, recycling banks, and vape shops all offer a recycling service for batteries and vapes.

We spoke with Jon, a long-term foster carer for Barnsley who spoke about fostering in his own words. Here's what he shared about fostering as a single person, and the joy of seeing children in his care grow.

"Being a long-term foster carer is a bit different; all plans are medium to long term, such as building up skills for young people to grow up and achieve their ambitions, and develop good relationships with their schools, as

"You need to have a realistic expectation of the young person and put the hours in – I learn something new every day! We are also currently learning how to play guitar together.

"It's important to support them to develop their own identity, and it's great to see the change in them as they grow in confidence."
