Teacher / Staff Let's Hear Your Voice Survey: Summary Page

What is the survey?

Let's Hear Your Voice is a pupil health and lifestyle survey that takes places every two years for children and young people in Year 4,6,8,10 and post 16 across Barnsley.

What does the survey ask?

The survey covers a variety of different age-appropriate health and wellbeing questions and was created by the Children's Public Health Team at Barnsley Council.

When is the survey completed?

The survey <u>must</u> be completed during school time and in a single sitting, as pupils will not be able to save and return to their responses. This is to preserve anonymity. It is advisable that pupils complete the survey in the school's computer room.

Is it confidential?

The survey is anonymous and does not contain any identifiable information.

Do pupils have to take part?

It is not mandatory to take part in this pupil survey. It is up to pupils whether they wish to take part.

What do I need do before pupils complete the survey?

Pupil presentations: We recommend showing pupils the presentation specific to their age group. These could be delivered in a whole-year assembly or in the session before the survey is completed. Your school setting can decide how to deliver the presentations, but these should help children and young people to make an informed decision about whether to participate.

Parent/carer letter: It is advisable that the parent letter is edited (including your school's name) and sent out to all parents regardless of age to ensure they are informed about the survey before it is completed in school.

What will happen to the results?

Results will be collated into a population level dashboard. Schools completing the survey will receive a unique school level report with their data. This will help schools to tailor health and wellbeing approaches in setting.

What if children require support?

They are first and foremost advised to speak with a trusted adult in the school setting.
